10.0 Concerning the advisability 5.00 of planting peanuts in this sec-3.00 tion the American State Bank of this city has been making some inquires and their findings are most interesting as showing this crop to be among the best money makers and especially adapted to the McLean soil and climate.

In a communication from the Texas Peanut Co. at Hrwley, Texas, they are informed that this crop makes an average of fifty bushels to the acre there and will sell from 90 cents to \$1, 25 per bushel. It is understood the soil of that section, while sandy, is an inferior grade and not considered of much value for anything else, but the peanut crop has brought its average selling price up to forty dollars an acre. This land is not only sandy but is rich in plant food and very productive, and it is safe to say that the peanut would find its natural home here, giving an even better yield than obtains in the Hawley coun-

With fifty bushels of peanuts C. R. I. & G. selling at 90 cents per bushel an acre of land would bring the farmer \$45, and this is about three times as much as could possibly be expected from an acre of Indian corn on an ordinary year. Another thing in favor of the Spanish peanut is the fact that it always finds a ready market, the same as cotton and other staple farm crops.

The bank is offering a ten dollar premium on the best acre of this crop and we would like to see a number of our farmers give it a fair and thorough test.
