

Sun Spots

The naval observatory says that after appearing on the sun's eastern limb spots remain visible for about two weeks. By solar rotation they are carried behind the western limb. If still existing they reappear again about a fortnight later. Spots are at times seen to form on the sun's visible hemisphere.

Different methods are used by fire eaters to keep the tongue and hands from burning. Some rub the skin of the parts to be affected with hard soap, the tongue included, and over that a layer of powdered sugar is placed. Others use a solution of alum, or liquid storax.

The bureau of standards says that the length of time that a sound will remain perceptable after the source of sound has ceased operating depends on several factors: The volume of the room, the nature of its interior finish and the intensity of the initial sound.

ultimate end of all feed crops is to be fed to animals at a profit, and if a man hundreds of miles away can buy Texas raised feed and ship dairy products to Texas, paying transportation both ways at a profit, why cannot the Texas farmer feed his crops on the farm and sell dairy products at a larger profit? This can be done, and every bit of feed shipped from the home community represents a distinct loss, both to the farmer and the community.

The streets of the town belong to the citizens and are under control of the city council from property line to property line, including walks curbs and parkway, and the city has the right to prescribe the way such improvements shall be placed. Driveway curbe, steps in walks, and things of like nature that might cause an accident can be used as evidence in court toward securing damages, both from property owner and the city. Both property owner and the city are concerned in seeing that such improvements are put down to conform to existing laws, if future trouble is to be saved. It will only take a few minutes interview with the street commissioner to ascertain how to put in these improvements, and it means satisfaction and money saved for everyone concerned. Now is a good time to make plans for such improvements for next spring, and such plans should begin with ascertaining the provisions of the city ordinance governing the same.






