### American News Executive Talks With Mussolini On Importance of February Arms Limitation Meet

Editor's Note: Robert J. Federer, vice-president and general news manager of the United Press, was received in audience by Premier Benito Mussolini of Italy after the recent arrival of Secretary of State Stimson at Rome and following conversations which Stimson had with Mussolini and Dino Grandi, Italian foreign minister. During the interview, the Duke gave the United Press a striking statement of his feelings on the arms limitation conference to be held at Geneva next February. The interview is particularly timely and interesting in view of the general European situation and in light of the fact that Secretary Stimson will continue in Paris and Berlin his recordings of sentiment among leading European statesmen on the arms limitation question.

(Copyright 1931 by United Press) ROME, July 16 (U.P.)—The presence of the United States of America at the disarmament conference in 1932 is the most formidable guarantee of its success. Premier Benito Mussolini said in a private interview granted after his important conversations on disarmament with Secretary of State Henry L. Stimson. "I do not think Mr. Stimson's international reputation and the final solution of the serious economic problems. They are the first step.

"Without the United States, Mussolini said earnestly, the disarmament conference would be a failure just as so many other conferences have been failures on this side of the Atlantic.

his English words carefully as he continued: "There is no other road if western civilization is to live. As we stand before 1932, we are facing a great uncertainty. On our decision depends the future of the world.

"If we decide for peace, we will have saved humanity. If we decide for war, we will plunge the world into chaotic disaster.

In response to my query as to whether President Hoover's memorandum proposal had yet shown any benefits and how far it constituted a solution to the present economic crisis, Mussolini replied: "Already the restorative effects of President Hoover's proposal for a moratorium have made themselves evident. Unemployment is decreasing in Germany and there are signs of resumption. The same is true in Italy and even in the United States. England is slow in starting, but the way is now open and there is a promise of normalcy.

"We even think we are muddling ways off then we really are. It takes some time for us really to believe our eyes that things are getting better because we have been thinking negatively all the time and living a low morale with nothing but depression in our minds. It takes us some time to get over that, but once we get our confidence back we will lift our horizon and see a brighter future.

Not Final "I do not think Mr. Hoover's proposals are the final solution. They are the first step. Others must come and almost everyone by this time is beginning to realize that disarmament is the overshadowing issue.

Mussolini then pointed to what he regarded as the fruits to be gained through a successful disarmament conference at Geneva. "The great powers," he said, "can get relief in disarmament. It is the

one place where budgets can be alleviated without affecting the welfare and happiness of a nation, it being generally understood that all disarm at the same time. If only from an economic viewpoint, disarmament is a pressing necessity and since the average nation spends about one-fourth of its revenues on its military establishment, the value of lightening the burden is evident.

"Not secondary to the immediate economic saving is the guaranteed disarmament will mean for a long period of peace. The re-establishment of the normal flow of commerce and the resumption of industry make peace an essential part of the world program.

## Mrs. Allgood's Weekly Letter

### How To Use A Surplus Of Cucumbers in Pickles, Relishes, Dill And Otherwise

Dear Club Members:

In making pickles, relishes or chow-chow the following directions should be followed in selecting your equipment:

Use only enamel pans and ladles, or wooden spoons, also stainless steel knives. Earthen jars and enameled kettles are best for bringing; if wooden kegs are used, scald thoroughly beforehand; if second-hand kegs are used, char inside to destroy odors. Pack in glass top jars and use small ones rather than large jars. The spices loosely in bag so flavor can be extracted. Use coarse pure grade salt and pure apple cider vinegar. Pack jars firmly before pouring over liquid and fill jar to overflowing.

**Corn Relish**

1 dozen ears corn  
1 head cabbage  
3 sweet red peppers  
3 sweet green peppers  
1 quart vinegar  
1 cup sugar  
2 tablespoons mustard  
1 tablespoon salt  
1 teaspoon turmeric  
1 tablespoon celery

Method: Cook corn for 3 minutes in boiling water to set milk. Cool and cut from cob. Cook all ingredients together for 20 minutes. Pack into clean hot jar and seal and process. This should be put in pint and half-pint jars.

**Dill Pickles**

Select well shaped medium-sized cucumbers. Place in the bottom of a clean earthenware jar, a few long, fresh, green, grape leaves, then a layer of dill and one-half ounce of whole mixed spices. Then another layer of cucumber, layer of dill. On top of dill place layer of grape leaves. The grape leaves not only make good covering but give good green color to pickles. Spinach leaves may be substituted for grape leaves.

Make a cold brine by combining 1 pound of salt, 1 gallon water, 1 pint vinegar and pour over pickles. Place wooden cover, or plate, on pickles with sufficient heavy weight on top to keep cucumbers below surface of brine. Cover top of jar with double layer of cheesecloth to keep out dust and to admit air.

If temperature of 86 degrees F. is maintained where pickles are stored for 10 to 12 days, this process should be completed.

Any scum should be removed as soon as formed. If allowed to remain it may cause softening or spoilage.

As soon as bubbling ceases and fermentation is stopped, transfer cucumbers and pack in glass jars. Drain brine, let boil and then cool. Pour over pickles, filling jars full. Seal tightly and store in cool, dark place.

## Bread and Butter Pickles

25 large cucumbers  
12 onions (white-medium)  
1-2 cup salt  
1 pt. vinegar  
2 cups sugar  
2 teaspoons mustard seed (white)  
2 teaspoons ginger  
2 teaspoons turmeric powder

Method: Let unpeeled cucumbers stand in water over night. Then slice cucumbers and onions and place in pan with the salt, add vinegar, sugar, mustard seed, ginger and turmeric powder. Boil all ingredients until peel turns yellow (about 40 min.). Pack pickles solid in sterilized jars and allow to stand 10 days before using.

**Sliced Cucumber Relish (Sweet)**

12 large cucumbers sliced thin  
1-2 quarts onion sliced thin  
2 teaspoons salt  
1-2 teaspoons turmeric  
1 red pepper chopped fine or  
1-2 teaspoon cayenne  
1 quart vinegar  
4 cups sugar  
1 teaspoon grated nutmeg
