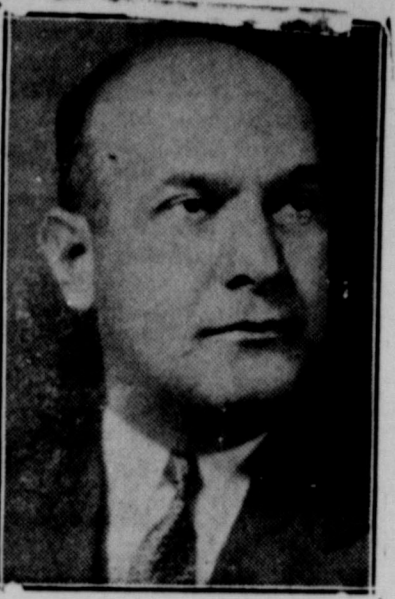
WHY I SHOULD LIKE TO BE A NURSE

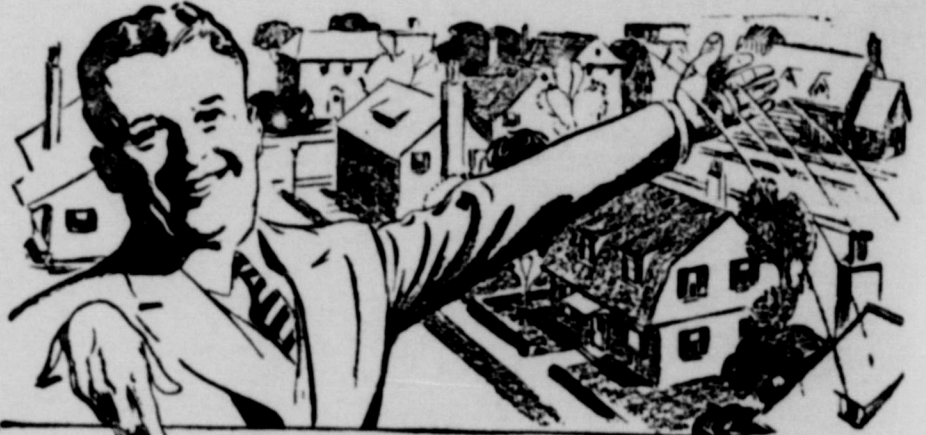
