33 Cars Wheat Are Shipped From McLean

At the present time, the prospects for row crops of the Mc-Lean area—including both feed and cotton-are the best in

That's the concensus of opinion of farmers, land owners, and the bserving public in general.

If-and of course there is al ays a big "if" in the cottor and feed growing game-weathe conditions are favorable between low and harvest time, the are nay produce beween 2,500 and 3,000 bales. Last year's production, despite a drouth in late July and all of August, was 1,700 bales.

Such a crop of 2,500 to 3,000 bales of cotton and an ample feed crop, coupled with the wheat crop which is now in, would bring dollars to this area which hav not been seen in many years.

The wheat crop is practically all harvested, and S. R. Jones. buying grain for the Paul Allison company of Fort Worth, has shipped a total of 33 cars of wheat -three more carloads than were shipped last year.

The average value of each car ran about \$3,700, which means that the wheat crop around Mc-Lean brought farmers approximately \$122,000 for the golden grain.
