

LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS.

Section 1. That Section 28 of Article III of the Constitution of and providing for the issuance of the State of Texas be amended so as to hereafter read as follows:

shall, at its first regular session OF TEXAS: after the publication of each United States decennial census, apportion the state into senatorial and representative districts, agreeable to the provisions of Sections' 25, 26, and 26-a of this Article. In the event the Legislature shall at any such first regular session following the publication of a United States decennial - census, fail to make such apportionment, same shall be done by the Legis- Governor and Lieutenant Govern- spouse. lative Texas, which is hereby created. and shall be composed of five members, as follows: The Lieutenant Governor, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, the Attorney General, the Comptroller of Public Accounts and the Commissioner of the General Land constitute a quorum. 




