## CLOSER TO HOME

SOME OF US have perhaps remained untouched by the recent campaign of Sigma Delta Chi, professional journal istic fraternity, and other groups to inform the people of

Information released last week, however, that 57 persons the problem a little closer home. It adds impetus to whatever concern most of us have been able to muster over the situation.
Just how many may understand the problems with which the state institutions are faced was indicated recently by interviewed by the poll indicated they had read or heard something about state hospitals or mental wards during the past several months. Of this group, 96 per cent sald they understood state hospitals were overcrowded. Governor Shivers has been emphasizing that improve-
ment of conditions in state wards as "one of the biggest problems the state has ever had to face." He called the special session of the legislature, which convened Tuesday, to consider appropriations for the hospitals and has indicated he will present no other issues to the body while
it convenes.
That the problem is important to Gray County, as well as the rest of the state, is indicated by figures released
by the State Board for Hospitals and Special Schools. Gray County citizens now in mental hospitals number 40; five more are inmates of hospitals for the mentally deficient; seven are in epileptic hospitals; three in bilind
choois: one in a tuberculosts hospital; and one in an orphans home.
With this situation multiplied all over the state, it is easy to see why the problem is considered one of gravity Many of these people might be rehabilitated and returned to normal life if an adequate staff and proper We sincerely hope the spectal sesston of the legtesature will produce a remedy for the ills that plague the inst1tutions, as well as those, who of necessity must be placed in them.
Economy in government is something we advocate. But e have cut corners too long with the patients in our to return to a normal life on the outside.
