

Report On Rural Tax Proposals

A concentrated effort is now being made in Austin by proponents of the controversial report of the Governor's Committee on Public School Education on behalf of the tax equalization program proposed in the report, now under study in House and Senate sub-committees.

This effort is receiving strong editorial support from metropolitan newspapers, based on the Bartlett tax study made for the COPSE report. This study is based on a highly questionable and disturbing premise that the agriculture economy of the state can afford this tremendous new tax burden. It also purports to prove that city schools are being cheated out of their fair share of school tax money by rural areas.

One recent editorial quoted an example to show that a rural landowner pays much less than the amount of school taxes being paid by an urban resident. Any shirt - sleeved economist can quickly spot the fallacy in these statistics.

Let's look at a city dweller who draws a salary of \$12,000 a year and owns a \$20,000 home. If his school tax rate is \$1.50 per \$100 and he is taxed on 50 per cent of market value-or \$10,000-his school tax bill will be \$150 a year.

Now let's look at a rural landowner who owns a 1,000 acre farm or ranch, with an assessed value of \$150 per acre. He cannot by any stretch of the imagination, come close to netting the \$12,000 annual income of his city



During spring every fisher-man should have his own crystal ball.

For this is the time of year when the whims of weather affect fishing success the most. During these critical weeks not only success, but the fun of going fishing can be ruined by sudden weather changes.

However, you can be your own weather expert. According to the fishing authorities at Mercury outboards there are ways to analyze weather and what it means to your chances of fishing success. attack of appendicitis and was The secret lies in interpreting the forecast in terms of how it affects fish.

Rapid changes in barometric pressure, up or down, greatly affect fish feeding activity. A sudden change in air pressure seems to disturb fish and they quit feeding. Most barometric changes are due to the formation of fronts — either cold or warm.

Cold fronts form when cold air pushes its way under a warm air mass, forcing it up. Cold air replaces warm air, clouds form, and violent rainstorms often rage in a narrow line along the front. Air pressure becomes heavier and the wind reverses direction from its normal clockwise flow. Cold fronts generally mean storms; storms usually put fish off their feed.

Warm fronts lessen the air pressure, bringing clouds and thunderstorms along a wide belt. This, too, will cause fish to stop feeding.

Of course, there are exceptions to these general rules. At times fishing in the rain - a slow drizzle, usually can be very productive.

Watch for forecasts of

frontal activity. Know that they bring sudden changes in temperature, wind direction and air pressure. Remember that rapid changes in these three factors drastically affect fishing success - usually for

> Not only can lightning strike in the same place twice, it can strike the same place many times. To believe otherwise could cost you your life.

A case in point is the Empire State Building. One summer it was struck 15 times in 15 min-

Thunderstorms are common in Texas now, associated with spring's changing weather. Every clap of thunder is a lightening bolt.

A single bolt from one thunderstorm is sufficient to cause injury, death or property damage. Most vulnerable are persons who live, work and play in rural or open areas. Campers, golfers and swimmers are particularly vulnerable since lightning will usually strike the highest object in an open area. Just recently two fishermen were killed in North Texas when caught on a lake by a sudden storm and struck by lightening.

Many people will run under a tree when caught in a storm exposing themselves to a great danger, since lightning often strikes lone trees. The bolt travels down the moist interior of the tree, building up extreme heat and pressure which causes the tree to literally explode. As the electrical charge travels downward, small streamers may depart from the main bolt, jumping to nearby persons or objects. Many golfers and others are killed in this manner,

And, persons standing in a large open area where there are no tall objects are equally vulnerable to a lightning strike. Farmers working in fields or riding a tractor often are struck.

If a thunderstorm develops while you are out in the open, head for a building and stay inside until the storm is over. If you are boating or swimming. leave the water and get to a building. If there is no building available head for a grove of trees but avoid the tallest tree or lone trees. In an open area, lie down until the storm pases. An automobile with a steel body is considered a safe place since the steel shell will lead the charge of electricity to the wheels, from where it will jump to the ground. But a convertible doesn't afford protection.







Mrs. Housewife And The Grocery Budget

"Today you spend a bit over 17 percent of your after tax income dollar for food, a record low for the United States, and a proportion unequaled by any other Nation. Only about 14 percent of your after tax dollar goes for food that you eat at home against more than 16 per cent as recently as 1960. A significant proportion of the monthto-month over-all food price rise during 1968 has reflected the rising cost of eating out due largely to the mounting labor cost it restaurants

"How can the cost increase in Mrs. Housewife's food budget be explained? It certainly is not all her imagination that her shopping trips to the grocery store are costing more.

There are a number of explanations and some of the most significant ones are the follow-

1. The consumption of beef on a per person basis has soared from 59 pounds a year in 1945 to 106 pounds a year. This increased preference for the higher price types' and cuts. Another reason for the increase in food consumption would be teenage children. This is the year when the younger generation is becoming a majority of the population and the younger generation is composed of big eaters. To illustrate this point, the Agriculture Department has calculated the weekly cost of feeding a family of four in which two children are pre-schoolers to be \$28,50. But, if the children were teenagers, the cost would soar to \$39.90,


