The result, it said, has been the production of "a small number of guns and a great amount of butter with a considerable number of lollipops thrown in."

Brazil Troops Fight Off Reds At Ammo Dump

By JIMMIE S. PAYNE
RIO DE JANEIRO (AP)—Brazilian coastal provinces stretching more than 1,400 miles along the Atlantic were reported under a state of military alert today after troops fought off an attempt to blow up a Natal ammunition dump.

A Meridional News Agency dispatch from Natal said armed Communists made two night attacks on a regimental barracks in an effort to get at the ammunition dump. Troops beat them off with machine guns.

The news agency said Gen. Zenobia da Costa, commander of the area which stretches from Rio de Janeiro to Natal, ordered the alert. Machine guns were set up around Army barracks in the capital last night. Apparently Da Costa feared further Red attacks against the Army.

Da Costa, who has been in charge of a campaign against communism in the Army, sent his resignation to President Getulio Vargas. It appeared to be an effort to make Vargas clearly take sides on the Red issue and perhaps force out high officials accused of being Red sympathizers.

The Meridional agency quoted a presidential spokesman as saying Vargas will refuse to accept Da Costa's resignation.

Investigations made since it started work in July, 1950, soon after outbreak of the Korean War. It said investigations showed this about the mobilization program:

"Deliveries on defense hard goods—planes, tanks, ammunition and guns—had fallen dangerously behind schedule; so much so that the chances of reaching the minimum preparedness targets within the time set by our military planners seemed remote."

One basic cause for this, the committee said, is "failure of our responsible officials" to give weapons speed claim on the nation's industrial capacity.

And back of this the committee found "apathy" among some government agencies. "Those responsible for the nation's current rearmament program lack the sense of urgency that has previously goaded Americans into their tremendous preparedness achievements," it said.

Escape From Reds In Boxcar Full Of Barrels Of Wine

VIENNA, Austria (AP)—A Hungarian and his wife, who escaped their Communist homeland by hiding in a boxcar of wine barrels, are being held by police here for illegal entry into the American zone of Austria.

The couple started their daring six-day flight from a town near Budapest. Nestled among wine barrels consigned to Switzerland, they somehow were missed by Hungarian customs inspectors when the car crossed into Austria three days ago.

They remained in hiding through Austria's Russian zone. Yesterday, as the car rolled into the freight yards at Linz, they pounded on the sealed car and attracted the attention of railway workers who released them.

Trucker Strike In The East Is Reported As Breaking Up

PITTSBURGH, March 20 (AP)—"Voluntary truck blockades" protesting Pennsylvania's 45,000 pound gross weight limit . . . which slowed TRUCK traffic into the state from Ohio and New York were breaking up this morning.

Police estimated that more than

200 large interstate trucks had voluntarily halted in Ohio and New York state near the Pennsylvania border in observance of a midnight blockade set down by some 300 independent truckers.

The vehicles were halted on U. S. highway a heavily traveled trucking line into Pennsylvania, near Conneaut, O., and near Ripley, N. Y. Truck traffic on the Pennsylvania Turnpike, the superhighway which spans the state from the Ohio border to near Philadelphia, was reported "very light" by state police.

In the state itself, a spokesman for the independent operators who started the protest, estimated some 4,000 to 5,000 vehicles would be idle.

Laird Bruner, business agent of the United Truckers Association, said roving pickets had been dispatched to various points over Pennsylvania to ask drivers to quit work.

A new law which would have raised the gross weight limit on the commonly used type of truck to 60,000 pounds was vetoed by Gov John S. Fine early this year.

Decision Due On Lifting Of Cotton Control

WASHINGTON (AP)—The government hopes to decide in the next week or 10 days whether to lift price controls in a half-dozen major raw product fields, including wool and cotton.

Price Stabilizer Ellis Arnall told the Senate Banking Committee yesterday the Office of Price Stabilization hopes within two weeks to publish a statement on price control suspension policy, along with a preliminary set of standards.

He added that the first lifting of controls might come at the same time.

On the other hand, he said it may soon become necessary to place fresh fruit and vegetables under price controls if their prices continue to increase.

OPS officials said the first suspension actions might take place in five or six experimental areas. These might be actual suspension of controls or recommendations for close study in these fields.

Among the products named were wool, cotton, hides, tallow, lard and edible fats and oils.

Monkeys, Mice Used To Check Space Travel

WASHINGTON, March 20. (AP)—An Air Force scientist told Wednesday of a rocket catapulted 80 miles into space with live monkeys and mice aboard.

It was a preliminary test aimed at learning eventually whether man can fly in outer space, or in the border zone ranging up to 120 miles.

The mice are still living and propagating freely. The five monkeys survived the actual flights but four of them were killed when parachutes carrying them back to earth failed. The fifth monkey landed but died of heat prostration the New Mexico desert.

The account, which outdoes a lot of science fiction, was told at a meeting of the Aero Medical Assn. by Dr. J. P. Henry of the Air Force's aero medical laboratory at Wright-Patterson Base, Dayton, O. The tests were designed to determine the physical and psychological effects of being made "weightless" under certain conditions of extreme altitude flight.

TOPPED ITS GOAL Dimes Drive Seen As Success Here

The 1952 March of Dimes put the Howard County Infantile Paralysis Foundation back on its feet, as far as current obligations are concerned.

The Dimes campaign grossed \$12,037.96, according to Guilford Jones, retiring chairman of the local chapter's executive committee.

Edith Gay, secretary of the committee, said that campaign expenses amounted to \$254.55, leaving a balance of \$11,783.91. Of that amount, \$5,891.96 was retained by the local chapter, while a like amount went to the National Foundation.

The March of Dimes campaign's goal for this year was a gross of \$12,000.

Since the campaign was completed, the local chapter has paid off approximately \$2,500 in hold-over bills, which whittled the obligations to a few current bills. A small balance is on hand for 1952 operations of the chapter.

Officials of the chapter were pleased over response to the campaign. The local chapter had been fighting a losing financial battle prior to the 1952 campaign.

Jones has turned over chairmanship of the executive committee to Bernie Freeman, who will serve in that capacity until the March of Dimes campaign is concluded.

In 1951 the chapter had started with a balance of \$1,600, but the March of Dimes campaign that year brought in only \$5,400. That allowed only \$4,300 for the chapter's work last year, and those funds were exhausted several months before the 1952 campaign was started.

Housing Officer At AFB Is Rent Board Member

Lt. Thomas J. Christiansen, housing officer for Big Spring Air Force Base, has been designated military liaison representative to the city rent advisory board, it was announced today by Base Commander Ernest F. Wackwitz Jr.

Purpose of this move, Col. Wackwitz explained, is to have a military representative present at board meetings to help explain and coordinate rent problems concerning the airmen stationed at the base. Lt. Christiansen will have no voting power in decisions reached by the board.

Lt. Christiansen is a native of Michigan and a graduate of Michigan State College where he received his degree in chemistry. His Air Force duty has included assignments in the Far East and Japan during 1946-47.

Angelo Students Chip In To Help Drive For Tides

AUSTIN, March 20. (AP)—Junior high school students of San Angelo have chipped in \$30 to help Texas fight for its tides.

A Texas history class in San Angelo's Robert E. Lee Junior High originated the campaign, distributing posters and lapel tags and putting stories in the school paper to publicize the issue.

Gov. Shivers wrote to Principal Noble C. Smart and asked that his personal thanks be conveyed to the students. This is the fourth period Texas history class in particular. "It is such loyal support as this that makes me confident Texas will be ultimately victorious in regaining title to our submerged lands," the governor wrote.

The U. S. Supreme Court has ruled the Federal government has paramount rights to the oil-rich submerged lands. A fight is now being waged in Congress on whether to recognize this policy or to quit claim the tidelands to the coastal states.

Dimes In Parking Meters Give City, Motorists Fits

Dimes and Big Spring parking meters just don't work together, or co-operate in any way, according to Tommy Malone, the city's meter man.

Sometimes a meter gets jammed with sand but more often it's a dime that causes all the trouble—and the motorist who deposits the dime just loses the coin and doesn't get any parking time, because the dime isn't heavy enough to trip the coin mechanism.

Every dime that goes into a meter, usually the penny or nickel that follows it, slips down beside the dime and the meter is jammed. Malone knows what every meter in town is supposed to average in collections and he says that those jammed with a dime usually turn up at least 50 cents short because motorists haven't been able to get coins in them.

And it is rather exasperating to spot a space, drive into it, and then try to get a coin into a meter that somebody has jammed with a dime. The usual choice is to leave the car on a red meter or get back in, start up again and hunt another space where the meter will work.

If the car is left on a red meter and a ticket-writing policeman finds it, he hasn't but one choice, to leave a ticket, because he has no way of knowing that the meter has been jammed with a wasted and careless dime. The ticket necessitates a trip to the City Hall, and an explanation, and maybe, concludes the annoyed motorist, it's just cheaper and easier to pay the \$1 and forget the whole thing.

Yes, the motorist who puts a dime in one of Big Spring's parking meters, not only loses the dime

but he sometimes causes a lot of trouble and inconvenience for others. The better way, says Malone, is to save your dimes for the next March of Dimes, and then use the less valuable coins for the parking meters, and everybody will be happier.

Paintings Real, But Artist Never Has Seen A Fight

ABOARD U. S. S. VALLEY FORGE IN KOREAN WATERS, March 20. (AP)—Chief quartermaster John H. Montgomery has never seen an air strike but his carrier's pilots say his paintings of air battles are authentic and realistic.

The pilots daily fly combat missions over Red Korea. Montgomery, a native Texan, is a veteran of 17 years naval service. He has had no formal instruction in oil painting. He began painting while a student at Texas City High School.

In 1948, some of his work was exhibited in San Diego. One of his most recent canvasses on aerial strikes adorns the cabin of Rear Adm. F. W. McMahon, commander of Task Force 77.

Montgomery's wife, a stepson and a stepdaughter, reside at San Diego. His parents, Mr. and Mrs. Fred S. Montgomery, live at 325 Fifth Ave., North, Texas City.

Hen Coming To Save The Family Budget

WASHINGTON. (AP)—The hen is coming to the rescue of the family with the pinched budget. The Agriculture Department said today the hen is laying enough eggs now to provide two large ones daily for each person—at a cost from 8 to 10 cents for the individual meal.

As a substitute for higher-priced meats, eggs provide proteins essential to good diets, the department said.

Smuggling On Rise In Singapore Port

By A. L. MCINTYRE
SINGAPORE (U.P.)—The U.N. blockade of Red China and boom conditions in Singapore have transformed this great trading center into a teeming hub of two-way smuggling.

Bigtime operators, who long have used loopholes in this great port to smuggle in opium for rich Chinese addicts, now use the same loopholes to send out strategic war materials to Communist countries.

With Red China as their ultimate destination, quantities of tin, rubber, tires, auto parts, tinsplate, carbon black and other war necessities are flowing out of the colony despite the official ban.

The British authorities admit cargoes are getting past the customs and port control, but plead senior customs officials cannot be everywhere at once and have to take the word of officers in passing outboard cargoes.

Said a customs spokesman: "Contraband, opium, gold, liquor and tobacco coming in is small compared to the volume of prohibited goods going out."

"Strategic materials are the money-making exports of smugglers," he declared, and named Red China and Indochina as the main "importing countries."

When Britain placed a ban on strategic war material exports to Communist China, illicit exporters here immediately looked for alternative channels to get supplies needed by the Communists out of the colony.

One method was to obtain export declarations for scrap material and

Kerosene Lamp Fuel Can Also Be Used To Power Jet Planes

HOUSTON, March 20, (U.P.)—There isn't any magic to the fuel that powers jet airplanes at speeds to make you whistle. Nothing new or revolutionary.

If you've ever lighted a kerosene lamp or cooked on a kerosene stove, you've used a fuel that's a kissing cousin to that powering Shooting Stars and Sabres across the sky.

You could use the same kerosene you did in that lamp or stove for jet fuel. But pure kerosene isn't as abundant, or as cheap, as the mixture now used commonly.

This mixture is JP4, a kerosene type fuel that is predominantly gasoline.

It has to be of a kerosene type to insure a high boiling range and a low freezing point. E. N. Lewis of the Humble Oil & Refining Company said a rough estimate of the percentage would be 70 per cent gasoline.

When refiners speak of kerosene type fuel, they mean fuel with a boiling range of kerosene. Thus, many kerosene types wouldn't be that clean, no-smoke fuel you used to get at the corner grocery store for mama's lamp.

Talking generally about jet fuels, Lewis, a head of a division of Humble's refining department, pointed out a jet engine needs a fuel that has a high boiling range, is non-corrosive and has no toxic odor.

The boiling range of your kerosene type fuels is up to 550 degrees, Fahrenheit. This is much higher than your gasoline fuels. The freezing point, too, is as low as minus 72 degrees, F.

Where your jet aircraft is radically different from your propeller or piston driven plane, so is jet fuel.

Ordinary aviation gasoline is of an extremely high test, to produce a very high anti-knock quality. It must be highly refined. Jet fuels don't need this anti-knock quality.

And where not all refineries are equipped to produce high test aviation gasoline, almost every refinery can turn out jet fuel. This means a greater production potential in the event of all out war and a sudden demand for tremendous quantities of jet fuel.

The first jet fuel produced during World War II was JP1. The JP means jet propelled. Next came JP2, with more gasoline content, and then JP3, the type most commonly used now.

It doesn't cost as much to produce jet fuel as it does high test aviation gasoline, but your piston type plane gets more mileage to the gallon, jets burn fuel at a tremendous rate.

Most jet fuel is produced for U. S. military needs and specifications for it are rigid. It must have a certain freezing point, be free of toxic odor, etc.

And because it is a mixture — not gasoline in the sense — doesn't mean that any sudden demand for increased supplies for jet fuel wouldn't be felt by the ordinary motorist.

Lewis, in reply to a question as to how civilian gasoline supplies would be affected by production of jet fuel in the event of an all out war, smiled and said, he didn't know.

"Probably like in the last one," he commented.

Process To Hike 'Cold' Synthetic Rubber Production

CLEVELAND, March 20 (AP)—The B. F. Goodrich Chemical Co. says today it has developed a new process which will make possible a 30

per cent increase in production of "cold" synthetic rubber. In addition, Goodrich said, the new method is cheaper, produces a more uniform product and requires less exacting technical control. Goodrich said it recently started using the process at the synthetic rubber plant it operates for the government at Port Neches, Tex.

Experimentation has been under way since 1949. Cold rubber is made at lower temperatures than synthetic hot rubber and is used in automobile tires and where extremely tough rubber is required. The new process uses a tetrasodium salt of ethylene diamine tetra-acetate, which forms complex compounds with the iron, calcium

and magnesium ordinarily found in water. This chemical is added to the water used in making cold latex. **Two More Ratify Pact** TOKYO, March 20 (AP)—Officials said today New Zealand and Ceylon have ratified the Japanese Peace Treaty.

RAF Men Convinced It's Good Idea To Keep Awake On Train

BERLIN (AP)—Three British airmen were back at their Royal Air Force camp here today, convinced it's a good idea to stay awake on Berlin's elevated trains. They learned their lesson during

almost a month in Russian captivity. The men were arrested in Germany's East zone on Feb. 24. German eyewitnesses said they apparently dozed off on the elevated and failed to get off at the last West Berlin stop. The Soviets released them last night after a British demand.

The highest percentage of steers to ever pass through the ring at a Howard County FFA and 4-H sale are in home lockers, according to County Agent Durward Lester. Twenty-two of the 23 sales calves have been butchered for home consumption and have dressed out better than 67 per cent. Thirteen of these carcasses are hanging at the Big Spring Locker Company and all are high prime beef. There's some fat there, of course, but there's also prime beef and a flavor that can't ordinarily be bought across the block. In reviewing the sales list, the 995-pound Hereford steer of Edgar Allen Phillips was bought by Johnny Ray Dillard of the Fairview Gin. The Creighton Tire Company bought the Bob Garrett lamb, and the Farmers Gin was the purchaser of the Jesse McCormick lamb. The Tranham and Wasson Furniture and Refrigeration Service bought the Frank Tate Jr., capon.

Bud Flanagan, co-operating with the Martin-Howard Soil Conservation District on his ranch nine miles southwest of Big Spring, has fenced out his stock tank. The fence around the pond will help protect the dam and spillway, and the grass above the tank will hold most of the silt out of the reservoir. Flanagan has constructed water facilities for the stock below the tank and this will keep the cattle out of the bog. The Department of Agriculture is moving its beef cattle experimental work from the famous Beltsville Farm in Maryland to Denver. Dr. R. T. Clark, who has been at the head of this department since 1949, will remain in charge. He will be assisted by A. L. Baker, who has been doing beef cattle research for the Bureau of Animal Industry for 25 years. Baker is being transferred from the Front Royal Beef Cattle Research Station in Virginia. The Front Royal Farm, up the Shenandoah Valley, from Washington, D. C., was originally established as one of the Army's first Remount Service Stations about the close of World War I.

A team from the Big Spring High School's FFA Chapter won the state leadership contest in farm skill demonstration in the green hand division held at Sam Houston State Teachers College in Huntsville. Demonstrating the caponizing of chickens, the team was made up of Calvin Daniels, Jim Dameron and Elbert Long, and was coached by R. E. Baumhardt, vocational agriculture instructor.

Corine Bishop, who farms 10 miles northeast of Big Spring has left about 50 acres of stubble to help control wind erosion and to put more organic matter into the soil, thus making the land soak up more water. Another believer in stubble, according to the supervisors of the Martin-Howard Soil Conservation District, is M. L. Watt, who lives five miles north of Sand Springs. He has 45 acres of land that is not blowing. He left a good stubble on it. Morgan Coates, a farmer who lives in the old R-Bar community, has listed about 40 acres of land, leaving the stubble on top of the beds which is helping prevent wind erosion.

Harold W. Hunt of El Centro, California, says that allowing four per cent for shrinkage he put an average of 5.45 pounds a day on four yearling Charbray bulls through a given feeding period of about a month. He says he has no trouble at all putting 600 pounds a month on Charbray calves after they have been weaned and well started. The Charbray is a cross between the Brahmas, and those French triple-purpose cattle, the Charolais, which are supposed to be the biggest cattle on earth. In France these white animals are used for beef, milk and for work.
