acclaim. When the idea of producing 300 bushels of corn on an acre of ground was initially put forth nearly 10 years ago, farmers and scientists alike scoffed, because that was 110 bushels more than the record at that time. Lamar, with his father as a willing but skeptical
partner, started his climb to the record in 1950. He was only 10 . That year, the father-son team spread manure bushels on one acre. Not satisfied, Lamar began dreaming of 200 bushels.
