## "END OF OPPORTUNITY LEGISLATION"

A bill has been introduced in both branches Congress (known as S-11 in the Senate and HR-11 tunity" legislation by its proponents. But people wh have studied the measure, and have weighed its po tentialities, think "End of Opportuhit
The bill would amend the section of the long estab lished Robinson-Patman Act which now says that when a seller meets a competitor's lower price in good faith, his action is justified. For example, under existing law a seller of petroleum products can reduce his price meet competition in order to hold onto his jobber protect a dealer in a price war
The new bill would change this reasonable provision A supplier, including jobbers, would not be permitted to meet a competitive price to the customer withou ers, no matter where located if such action might af fect competition. As every price change affects compe tition, the new bill would have virtually limitless appli cation-and it would, in effect, abolish a supplier price cut on part of his business.

matter have said passage of the bill would seriously undermine opportunity for enterprising small independ ent businessmen in that business-and also for such men in the distributive branches of other industries.
