

The possibility of relocating a number of refugee Cuban women in McLean for employment at the Marie Foundations factory is under consideration here, and residents are being encouraged to discuss the plan and

Calling attention to the plight of the refugees was a Reader's Digest article which disclosed that more than 162,000 Cubans have come to the United States to escape the rule of Communist Dictator Fidel Castro.

The article, appearing in the December issue of the Digest, reported that the political refugees were fleeing Cuba at the rate of 1,800 to 2,000 per week in October.

Since then, Castro has started limiting the number of airline flights from Cuba to the United States, and the flow of refugees has been reduced.

However, Dr. Tomas Duran, refugee himself who now lives in Amarillo, said in a talk before the McLean Lions Club Tuesday night that virtually everyone would like to leave Cuba.




