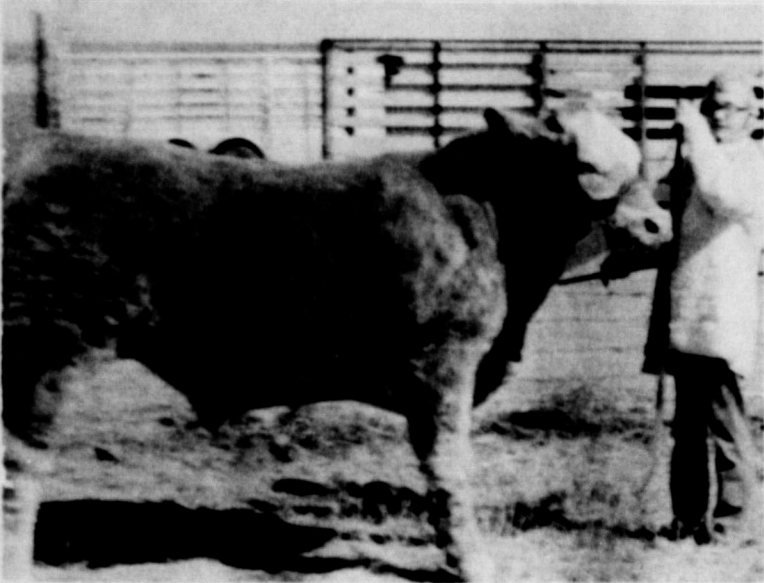
## McLean Schools To Have Open House March 9th

Tuesday will include the FFA Livestock Judging Contest starting at 9 a.m. and the judging of Hereford breeding cattle at 1 p.m., with Leon Langford of Texico, New Mexico, placing the sale order.

The Hereford Breeders Banquet will be held Tuesday night at 7:30 p.m. in the Coronado Inn, and the public is invited to attend. Tickets may be purchased at the Chamber of Commerce office.

The Junior Livestock Sale will get underway at 9:30 a.m. on Wednesday, March 8, preceded by a free country breakfast for all bidders from 8 to 9 a.m. Colonel Walter Britten, of College Station, will be the auctioneer.

The Hereford Breeders Sale will begin at 1 p.m. to conclude the three-day event, with Colonel Britten at the microphone. Forty head of registered cattle from the top breeders of the Top o' Texas area have been consigned.

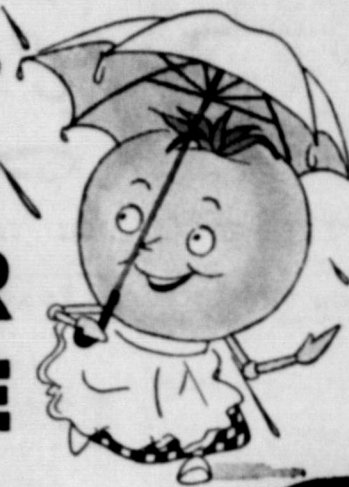

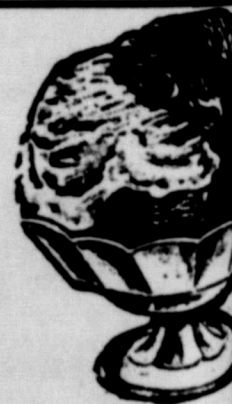

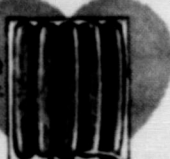

Fat cattle topped out at an all time high recently when finished steers brought over \$37. cwt. Since then, cattle have dropped back from \$1. to \$1.50 cwt. Replacement steers have dropped some since then, but still stand near all time high figures. Cattle on wheat are doing their very best and making excellent gains on excellent wheat pasture. Weather has been unbelievably fine. Abundant subsoil moisture pumped into the ground last fall by too much rain is now giving the wheat pasture an added boost with the extremely warm weather.

I heard one fellow ask another what he thought about the cattle market for this fall. His reply "optimistic, I just bought some 268# holstein steers for 43.50 per cwt. Holsteins weighing or selling for 34.00 weighing 520#. This is still high cattle.
