SALES TAX EXEMPTION

On March 13, 1972 the State Comptroller issued a new ruling that can save farmers and ranchers thousands of dollars in sales tax.

The new ruling now exempt many items that farmers and ranchers buy that formerly were taxed.

The new interpretations pretty well exempts all items purchased that is used exclusively in the production of food items. Earlier supplies and parts for machinery were taxed. Under the new ruling most of these item; are not taxed today. Most items of a prefabricated or portable nature such as portable corrals, tences chutes, ga tes are exempt, while many items of a more permanent nature are not.

Another matter that is important to you. If you feel a tax has been added unjustly you may fill out a tax exemption form. In such a case the burden of proof is on the farmer or rancher signing the form ra-ther than the business man selling the product. I am leaving a few of these forms at the News Office. If you are a businessman you might want to pick up a copy of this form and extras run off for your customers. EMERGENCY DROUGHT PRO-


