Mrs. Lillie Johns Funeral Services Held Monday

Funeral service for Mrs. Lillie E. Johns, 85, of Panhandle formerly of McLean and in view, were held at 10 a. m. Monday in First Baptist Church of McLean.

Rev. Herman W. Bell, pastor officiated, assisted by David Paltz, minister of McLean Church of Christ. Graveside services were held at 3 p. m. Monday in Plainview Cemetery.

Mrs. Johns died Thursday morning, May 11, of a stroke at the home of her daughter, Mrs. Bernice Gross of Casper, Wyo., whom she was visiting. She lived periodically in McLean for many years. She moved to Panhandle from Odessa in March 1971.

Surviving are two daughters, Mrs. Gross and Mrs. Maxine Johns of Odessa; a son, V. E. Johns of McLean, a sister, Mrs. Bernice Banta of Borger; a brother Ernest Johns of Sunray. Six grandchildren and 13 great-grandchildren.

Ray Co. Has 20 Fatal Accidents During April

The Texas Highway Patrol reported 20 accidents on all highways in Gray County during the month of April, according to Sergeant J. L. Dalrymple, Highway Patrol supervisor of this area.

These crashes resulted in one person killed and nine persons injured.

The rural traffic accident summary for this county during the first four months of 1972 shows a total of 68 accidents resulting in two persons killed, 177 persons injured.

The rural traffic accident summary for the 60 counties of Lubbock Department of Public Safety Region for April shows a total of 445 accidents resulting in 44 persons killed and 232 persons injured compared to April, 1971 with 445 accidents resulting in 17 persons killed and 276 persons injured.

The 44 traffic deaths for the month of April, 1972 occurred in the following counties: Cass County; Donley and Montague, each; Parker and Wise, each; Archer, three; Carleton, Hale and Wilbarger, two each; Gray, Floyd, Hall, Palo Verde, Randall, Terry and Wichita, one each.

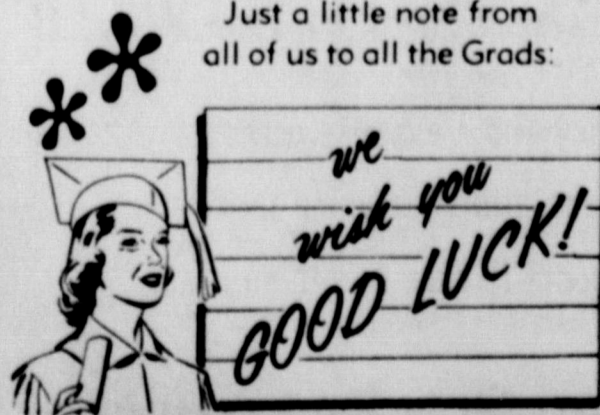
A noon lunch was served followed by a testimonies of conversation and answered prayers.

SALES TAX EXEMPTION

On March 13, 1972 the State Comptroller issued a new ruling that can save farmers and ranchers thousands of dollars in sales tax.

The new ruling now exempt many items that farmers and ranchers buy that formerly were taxed.

The new interpretations pretty well exempts all items purchased that is used exclusively in the production of food items. Earlier supplies and parts for machinery were taxed. Under the new ruling most of these items are not taxed today. Most items of a prefabricated or portable nature such as portable corrals, fences chutes, gates are exempt, while many items of a more permanent nature are not.

Another matter that is important to you. If you feel a tax has been added unjustly you may fill out a tax exemption form. In such a case the burden of proof is on the farmer or rancher signing the form rather than the business man selling the product. I am leaving a few of these forms at the News Office. If you are a businessman you might want to pick up a copy of this form and have some extras run off for your customers. EMERGENCY DROUGHT PROGRAM

As most of you know this program is now in affect. This approval to graze set aside and CAP acres has been granted through June 14th. Should we have more rainfall I feel very doubtful this would be extended past June 14. There is a charge of one dollar per acre. The most a landlord could recharge is \$1.50 per acre.

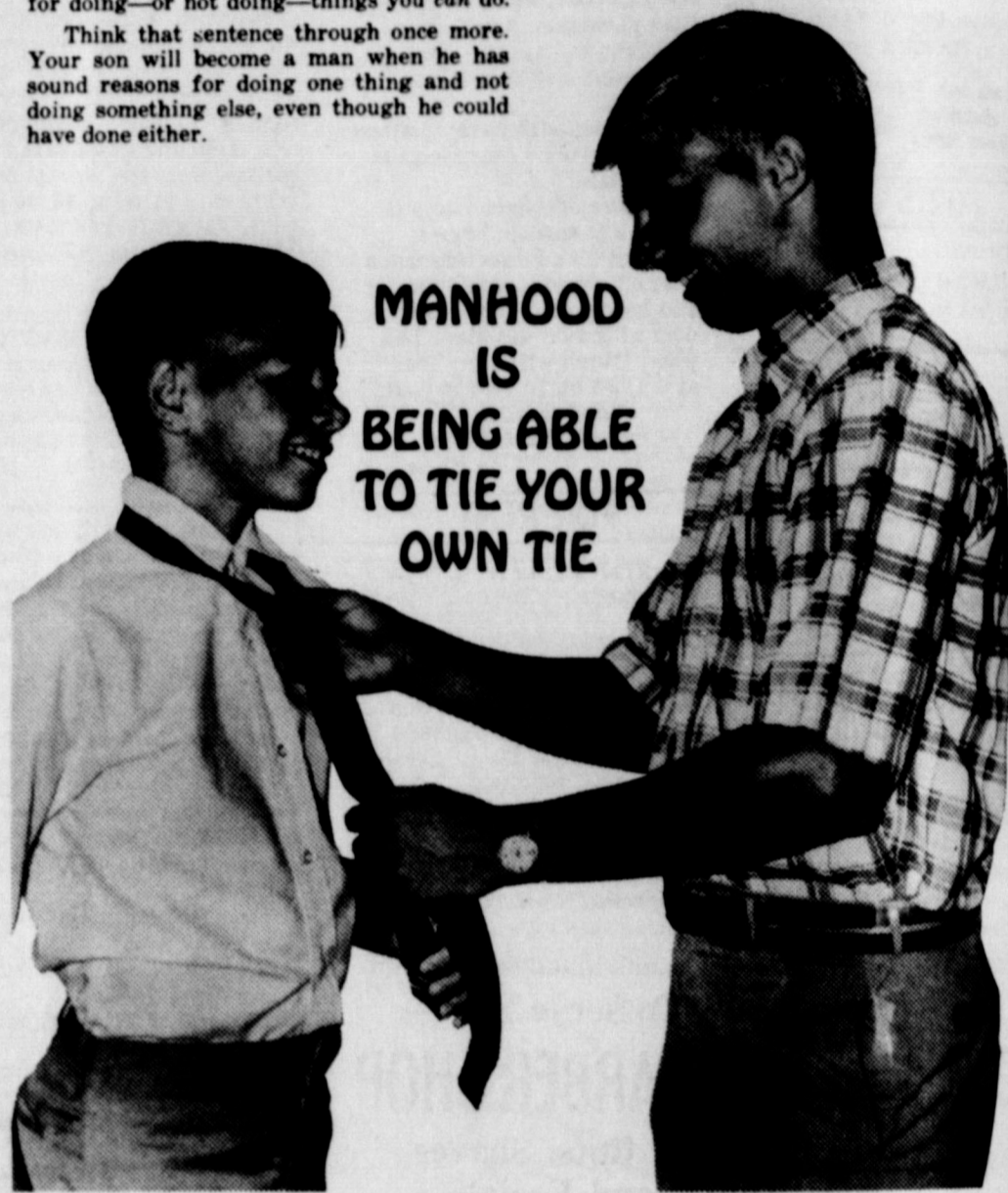
Here is one of those great epigrams of my favorite philosopher — Dad! Or was it Mother? It's hard to remember for sure.
