"Nothing could be farther from the truth, according to extensive studies and data accumulated over the past several years, "said Martin C. Wukasch, director of the Occupational Health
and Radiatica Control Division of the State Health Department.
"The safety record of the 22 nuclear power plants now in operation in the United States is an even 10 per cent. The total operating experience of these 22 plants is equal to abour
years, and there has pever years, and there has dever ocen a radiation release that exceeded regulatory guccelines. These nuclear
phants are constructed with almost 'fail-safe' self-quenc hing safety mechanisms. And in normal operation, the puclear plants emit less
tadia tion to the environment radiation to the environment
than naturally occuring cos than naturally occuring cos
mic radiation. There is mic radiation. There is
certa inly no radiation problem posed by tadiation em issions from the red granite in the State Capitol buildin but the Capitol emits more radiation than would a nuclear power plant. The knowledge that a nuclear power reactor con-
ta ins many millions of curie tains many millions of curies of radioactive fission produc has led to the conscious in position or severe safecy standaras by the gelease of operators, The fecase of
even a small fraction of this radioactivity in any circum stance, including a serious accident, is so unlikely to be deemed incredible by normal enginecring judg ment. Health ofnchs

Some of the cotton was weedy and late, indicating tions over much of the southwest are about the same. This means a continued strong demand for stocker calves.

I can't see much drop in the price of calves, About two weeks ago light calves took a $\$ 1.50$ drop.
