In 1972 Texas ranked
second a mong the 50 second among the 50 states
in the total number of fishing license holders according to the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service statistics. Texas sold 1,542,693
licenses, behind California with $2,261,766$ and ahead Minnesota with $1,486,871$.
Texas also ranked third in the total number of hunting license holders. Texas had 783, 103 hunting sylvania with 1, 122, 399 and Michigan with 785, 752 The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service defines a "liceregardless of the number of licenses he may purchase. Nationwide, the sale of licenses decreased in 1972 from the year before. But sale of fishing licenses increased.
Expenditures for hunting licenses were $\$ 108,000,00$ in 1972. Fishing license sales increased by $\$ 7$ million,

Right to Spank
"The right of parents to chaslise their children is so necessary
to the government of families and to the good order of society that no moralist or lawgiver has ever thought
its existence."
So said the Supreme Court of Tennessee a century ago. And it is still true today that parents have the basic legal right to spank their children.
But if the right itself is still rec ognized, the extent of the right has been steadily narrowed. that parents could be as brutal as they pleased, so long as their mo tive was "for the child's own


Thus, a father was found guilty of assault and battery for beating his 10 -year-old daughter with a cane, hard enough to leave permanent scars. The court said it was teach the child he was trying to One parent's harsh views about One parent's harsh views abou
discipline, said the court, could not outweigh the humanitarian standards of the community. Not only may an offending par-
ent be punished by the criminal ent be punished by the criminal
law, but in a growing number of law, but in a growing number of
states he may even have to pay damages to the child.
In one case a woman pummelled her small stepson so vi ciously that he suffered internal injuries. When a damage suit was

circle But the court held her liable. "Whyhow, it may seem repuenant," said the court, "to allow a (child) to sue his parent, we hink it more repugnant to leave a child with sulfered by reason of his parent' malicious misconduc
"A child, like every other individual, has a right to freedom
from such injury."

age of wheat is still standing and in my opinion the best crop is in prospect that I have ever seen, Wheat is now 30 inches high and heading. No need of moisture at present. One more good rain could set even the dry land farmers up for some 50 bu yields. Dry land wheat looks almost as good as the irrigated. If you want to see the prettiest wheat crop you have ever seen, take a drive this week end up 1-40 to HWY 70, then north to COYOTE PROGRAM
The Helicopter coyote con trol program has done wonders to reduce the coyote population, The nice thing about it is the fact a considerable savings was made by using the helicopter over other means.
