## June is Dairy Month... Hay Baling In Full

 Swing.Coming.

Among other things, June is Dairy Month. It's a time when dairy producers are hoping everyone remembers to drink an extra glass of milk each day, not just through June, but throughout the year

Dairy producers in Texas continue to be caught in the middle of a tightening cost-price squeeze. Even though their prices have shown some increase, their production costs have been soaring. Feed costs now are double from that of a year ago.

Dairy association spokesmen are worried about a reduction in production of milk. Reports from the Texas Crop and Livestock Reporting Service note that there has been a reduction of almost two per cent during the first four months of this year. Dairymen are faced with, rising production costs and a good market for dairy cows at their local auction markets.

The dairy industry is an important part of Texas agriculture picture. Texas ranks among the top 10 states in the nation in total production of milk; almost 3.5 billion pounds of milk were produced in Texas during 1972. Texas also is in the top 10 states in the nation in milk cow numbers with 360,000 head as of January 1

Texas dairy producers now total about 4,000 . Top counties in milk production in Texas are Hopkins Erath, Wise, Grimes, Johnson, Tarrant, EI Paso, Parker, Bexar, and McLennan.

Milk, any dairyman will tell you, is Nature's most perfect food. So, now is the time to enjoy summer with extra helpings of dairy products.
HAY baling is now in full swing throughout the state. Baling was off to a slow start due to the weather, but good hay crop is expected in most sections of Texas.

REMINDERS are being issued to users of 2,4-D and other hormone-type herbicides about their use during this time of year. Cotton is growing throughout the state, and that crop as well as many other is highly susceptible to herbicide drift.
e fure you re using 2,4-D or other such type herbicides be sure not to use it if the wind velocity is above 10 miles per hour. The herbicide can drift several miles.

Herbicides such as 2,4.D are valuable production tools for agricultural producers but they must also be used with care and concern

KEEP those screwworm samples coming to the fly lab at Mission, officials request. Texas is now experiencing one of its lightest years on record in number of screwworm cases.

The number of cases this year compared to last year is ten times less. Many livestock producers were fearful las year when the screwworm was completely

But the screwworm infestations are light this year, and that's due in part to continued reporting of suspected cases by livestock producers throughout the state. This enables officials with the program to counterattack the infestations and wipe them out before they can increase.

The screwworm eradication program in Mexico is also making progress, officials note. Through a cooperative effort between the United States and Mexico, the screwworm will be eradicated in Mexico.

Not all of these drownings involved swimmers and boaters. In far too many cases individuals fell from a place of presumed safety say a dock or river bank
into the water and were drowned. Children are most susceptible to this tvoe of incident. A good safety rule is to put a life jacket on a child playing near the water--just in case of a sudden, unplanned dip. Two children drowned this year in the Colorado River near Austin after being waus nature of the river bank on which they played What can you do to make your vacation or a weekend trip a happy, safe one? The State Health Department anc Texas Safety Association have some lifesaving point-

Fires on boats are especial ly terrifying since there is usually no place to run. You can either fight the fire, swim for your life, If you have fire extinguisher on board, you alternatives are cut in half, say department officials.
Splashing water on boat
fires won't help fires won't help since they
usually involve spilled gas line. Water merely spread the flames.
Four types of extinguishers are available for the boaterfoam, carbon dioxide (CO2)
freon and dry chemical freon and dry chemical,
Boat owners should mak Boat owners should make
sure the fire extinguisher sure the fire extinguisher they purchase has the $B-1$ or
$\mathrm{B}-11$ classification required B-11 classification required by the coast guard. This ed on the fire extinguisher. Boat owners should make frequent checks to be sure their extinguishers are in their proper storage brackets and undamaged. Cracked
or broken hose should be re or broken hose should be re
placed, and nozzles should placed, and nozzles should Locking pins and sealing wires should be checked to assure that the extinguisher
has not been used since last recharged.
Extinguishers should neve be tried merely to see if
they are in proper operating condition because in many cases the valves will not
properly reset, resulting in properly reset, resulting in
a gradual discharge.
