



### County Agricultural Agent Texas A. e.M. College Extension Service

By FOSTER WHALEY

Last summer a feeding test was run at Moody Farms to determine the cost of feed ot gains on long age-type eastern imported heifers. The cattle weighed 428 pounds, but had 550 pound frames. In a 120day feeding test the cost of gain was \$21.59 per cwt. Cost of gain the first 57 days came to \$15.73 ed to Fort Benning, Ga., Nov. 1. per cwt. on feed cost and \$3.50 other cost such as vardage, vet bills and handling charges, making a total cost per cwt. of gain come to \$19.23. The next 47 days of

> per cwt. on other cost. Cost on the final 20-day feeding period was \$25.05 per cwt. gain. \$21.86 per cwt. for feed and \$3.19

gain cost \$23.35 per cwt. and \$3.47

There is an increased interest in feeding cattle in both commercial feed lots and on farms.


