insolvent and closed by order of insolvent and closed by order of
the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation.

as the Bank of Commerce the next morning.

The bank was purchased by Gray Co. Bank Shares Inc., a
group headed by well-known area banker E.W. Williams, Jr. Williams, who owns interest in several Texas banks, including

Jim Rutherford, teachers will be available for tutoring from 3:45 p.m. to $4: 30$ p.m. on Tuesdays and Wednesdays each week. "According to the state inter-
pretations, tutoring will be volpretations, tutoring will be vol-
untary for failing students this untary for failing students this first six weeks." explained
Rutherford. "After first sixweeks priod, students who are failing may (not shall) be re-
quired to attend the free tutorquired to attend the free tutor-
ing offered by the schools this ing offered by the schools this
year." "However," Rutherford yent on to explain, "there will be no transportation to and from school provided for the students undergoing tutoring.
Among other changes teach-
ers, students and parents will ers,
be experiencing from the state legislatures new rules will be the shortening of the school year.

According to a press release frotion in Austin, the school year has been dropped from 180 days to 175.
However, students will not be
allowed to allowed to miss any classes.
Only five days of unexcused absenses during a semester will be allowed.
School districts must now have at leást one teacher for every 20 students, instead of one for every 25 students per
class. More than 175,000 teachclass. More than 175,000 teach-
ers are expected to open classes this fall in Texas.
Announcements in school will be limited to only one per day. Extra-curricular activities will
be scheduled for after school be scheduled for after school
hours to preserve the school day as much as possible for academics.
Students will be suspended from extracurricular activities if
they have a grade below 70 in they have a grade
any cacademic class. Students may not be granted social promotions. They must be promoted only on the basis of academic achievement. A grade
