30 Persons To **Die Over Holidays**

The Department of Public Safety is estimating 30 persons will lose their lives in traffic accidents this Christmas-New Year's holiday

season. It is estimated that 14 persons may die between 6:00 pm, December 24 through midnight, December

25, 1974. A total of 16 fatalities are likely to occur from 6:00 PM, December 31, 1974 through January 1, 1975.

Major C.W. Bell, Regional Commander said that the majority of these traffic deaths will be caused by the drinking driver or from excessive speed. Major Bell said, "In order to spare the Texas people of such grief and misery, the motorist should remember to plan their trips well in advance." Major Bell further urges the Texas motorists to make sure their vehicles are in good operating condition, and the driver is rested and relaxed before starting.

Captain J.W. Blackwell of the Texas Highway Patrol said, "Every Texas driver should be aware that all

clear-cut violations of the traffic laws will be rigidly enforced during this holiday period.







well. The justification for the ruling was that the operation which Doris needed was relatively safe. Why, say the courts, should the government bear the consequences of a person's unusual squeamish-

ness? The greater the risk, however, the greater the right of the ailing person to refuse surgery without losing his benefits. He may also refuse surgery on the ground that it is not likely to help him. Thus:

A truck driver was disabled by a severe back problem. Here too the government wanted him to undergo corrective surgery rather than collect disability payments.

But this time, the operation was both painful and dangerous-and the chance of success was no more than 50%. Ruling against the government, the judge said:

"This court will not require claimant to submit to such odds." One case involved a man who was unable to hold a job because he drank too much whiskey. In seeking social security payments,




