AUSTIN - A senator and a representative revived an old idea for a new reason-
dividing big Texas into five states. Sen. Bob Gammage, a Houston liberal, and Rep. Fred Agnich, a Dallas Republican, proposed a 1976 referendum on the big carve-
up. Gov. Dolph Briscoe imme-
diately frowned publicly their proposition, and few colleagues were expected to go along in the legislature. Agnich recommended a division by population into and West Texas. Rep. V. E. "Red" Berry of San Antonio regularly recommended dividing Texas, in the interest of bringing liquor-by-the-drink and horse
racing to South Texas racing
Gammage and Agnich wa to increase Texas' clout on the national scene. With five states, they argue, the states of Texas could have 10 U.S. senators and a proportional toral votes.

## Farm-facts

Compiled From Sources Of The Texas Depertment of Agriculture Cn C. White Commissioner

Agriculture Day Set March 24... Farm Labor Force Increases . . . Red Meat Production Shows Jump . . . Some Words About Onions, Turkeys, Sheep.

National Agriculture Day is March 24. A number of activities are now being planned to point ... the importance of agriculture to the erm. putial plans are being readied to arru.......tes with the financial facts of life ch marmers are also going to get the word on the importance of their business as it relates to the rest of the economy.
All in all, its purpose is to create better understanding between the agriculture producer and the consumer.

AN 11 PER CENT increase in the farm labor force in Texas is reported by the Texas Crop and Liwestock Reporting Service. The farm labor force numbered 230,000 during a recent period. The 11 per cent increase for Texas compares with a one per cent decrease on a national basis. Family workers in Texas made up 70 per cent of the farm labor force.

PRODUCTION OF RED MEAT in. Texas during January is 21 per cent above a year ago; nationwide, the increase is four per cent more than a year ago. The 243.8 million pounds this January in Texas compares with 201 million pounds in January a year ago.
The increase is significant in that it shows more cattle are being slaughtered, hence a reduction in livestock numbers.
But there still are record numbers of livestock on farms and ranches. The numbers of feeder cattle available are such that little or no price relief is expected for the cow-calf operator until probably 1977

ONION crop forecast for Texas this spring is 12 per cent below a year ago. Acres for harvest are estimated at 17,500 , which is down 17 per cent from a year ago. The crop is two to four weeks later than normal in the Valley due to weather conditions.
Supplies are expected to remain light until later this month and possibly early April. Peak movement should take place in late April or early May. In the Coastal Bend only a small acreage has been planted and harvest is expected to begin there about mid-April. At Laredo, the crop is making fair progress; harvest is expected to begin about April 10. In the San Antonio-Winter Garden area, the crop is two weeks later than normal, thus hervest will not begin until late April or early May

SHEEP AND LAMBS on feed in Texas continue to show a dramatic decline as well as some improvement. Drylot sheep feeders with a lot capacity of 2,000 head or more had 62,000 sheep and lambs on feed as of March 1. This is 45 per cent below a year ago, but is 13 per cent above a month ago.
