Amendment No. 1 has two major purposes: (1) to consoli date nearly all constitutional provisions relating to state and section of the Constitution; and (2) to lift the ceiling on state contributions to state systems from the existing maximum of 6 percent of the aggregate compensation paid to individ uals to a maximum of 10 percent.
