Older Texans Festival Planned

Older citizens in McLean will celebrate, along with the rest of Texas--and one local group wants to make it "special."

A planning meeting for a countrywide celebration of May--Older Texas Month is set for 7:30 p.m. at the High School Auditorium on Friday, May 30th, according to Mrs. Vela Corcoran, Director of "Young at Heart" McLean Senior Citizen's Association Inc.

The meeting is open to the public.

"We'd like to have a countywide celebration, such as a festival, to honor our older citizens and the contributions they've made," Mrs. Vela Corcoran said.

"This year's theme for May Older Texas Month is 'Bicentennial--Heritage-Festival-Horizons,'" the agent added.

"We would like to focus the countywide celebration on that theme by emphasizing the rich heritage we enjoy because of the efforts of our older citizens. Linking that idea with a festival to pay tribute to these older citizens, then, is also in keeping with the theme."

"Also, we hope the festival will point out horizons for our oncoming generations, who are planning for a better tomorrow. In looking toward those horizons, we might take a glance backward at some of the examples set by our older citizens," Mrs. Vela Corcoran explained.

Local plans tie in with national celebration plans, including award presentations, and other programs to honor the nation's more than 20 million people 65 or over this year, she added.

City Receives \$2,223.07 In Sales Tax Rebate

Comptroller Bob Bullock issued checks totaling \$19.9 million to Texas cities in the second round of monthly city sales tax payments.

McLean was mailed a check for \$2,223.07 by Comptroller Bullock.

The May payments were up from \$16.1 million rebated April 15 when the monthly system replaced the old quarterly rebate system with its 60 to 90 day lag time.

The May rebates were made from money received by the Comptroller between April 4, the cutoff for April's payments, and May 2 Bullock said.

"HIDDEN IDOLATRY"

In Ezekiel 8:12 we read that God revealed to His prophet the secret idolatry of the elders of Israel. "Hast thou seen what the ancients (elders) of the house of Israel do in the dark, every man in the chambers of his imagery?" He asked Ezekiel.

Idolatry in the heart always precedes open idolatry. The elders of Israel were to concerned about their reputation to practice open idolatry with the masses. They, however, had their private chambers where they practiced that which was an abomination before God. They thought they were safe: They said, "The LORD seeth us not."

What hypocrisy? What foolishness! "They eyes of the LORD are in every place, beholding the evil and the good" (Prov. 15:3). "... God shall bring every work into judgment, with every secret thing, whether it be good, or whether it be evil" (Eccl. 12:14). "For we must all appear before the judgment seat of Christ; that every one may receive the things done in his body, according to that he hath done, whether it be good or bad" (2 Cor. 5:10).

In their "private chambers" untold millions today bow down before the gods of pleasure, wealth, materialism, strong drink, drugs, promiscuity and suchlike. Not unlike the Jewish leaders in Ezekiel's day, they think that their form of idolatry is hidden from God. But the Lord knows when we have taken gods before Him...when He does not come FIRST in our lives. Remember the words of the apostle Paul: "... God shall judge the SECRETS of men by Jesus Christ according to my gospel" (Rom. 2:16). No one hides from God!
