A select House committee already has directed its staff to draft several articles of impeachment against 229th District Judge O.P. Carrillo of Duval County.
Committee members rounded out their examina-
tion of the record in their tion of the record in their
inquiry into allegations inquiry into allegations
against Carillo last week in closed-door session.
They will vote in open
session on the proposed arsession on the proposed ar-

11-member panel vote to press any of the articles, the House must be called into session to consider them on the third Monday following the committee report.
The constitution further provides that the Senate must try impeachment charges brought by the House against certain state officials, including district judges.

cent years, and one of the Texas Department of Healt Resources.
Where ambulances once were directed toward speed they now put emphasis on sustaining services while sustaining services

The types of modular a bulances seen on popular television shows are beco ing quite commonplace across Texas. These are the preferred types and more
and more Texas communiand more Texas communi ties are installing them.
A move to further assist A move to further assist
communities in setting up communities in setting up
ambulance service, comambulance service, personnel has prompted the Division to has prompted the Division
place its training personnel place its training persion strate gional settings in Texas. No longer will it be necessary to call Austin for assistance, says Charles E .
King, director of the Emer gency Medical Services Div ision.
"S
"Supervisors are stationed in the Regions, " says King, "and they are enthusiastic about being close to those are knowledgeable in all are knowledgeable of the program - which includes Emergency Medical Services, Medical
Advisory Board, Civil Defense and Radiological Defense.
The EMS Program has had a tremendous effect on up-
grading ambulance services, and cities throughout the state have gone to highly trained personnel and sophis
ticated life-sustaining equip ticated life-sustaining equip
ment which goes far beyond that required for certification. In some cities, med ical colleges have entered attendants to assure the fin est use of equipment. the Health Resources Depart ment's emergency medical program had to knock on doors to interest cities and towns in attendant training.
And, the Division provided And, the Division provided
training, with help of local training, with help of loca medical society members.
But the life-saving program But the life-saving program
now has developed on such a broad scale that there's enough personnel to provide tra ining.
Througn its regional setup, says King, the Division pro vides expert consultation se vices with towns suddenly without ambulance service or those wishing to upgrade services. They help organ ize classes, inspect and cer tify ambulance and give ex aminations to those taking various training courses. They also do basic commun ications counselling, aiding operators of emergency veperly utilizing radio equipment.
"One of the most exciting fields in medicine today is in the area of emergencies, said King. Many emergenc teams operate from military helicopters to speed patient hospitals, he said. Andrew L. Woodward said the regionalizing of EMS per personnel is basically the same as the whole concept of regional offices--getting
services nearer those who need them and taking them
into areas which hav
ceived them before.
With regionalizatio many areas find the EMS re presentatives can coordinate between agencies and other interested personnel in the ormulation of a more effic formulation of a
