There is one technique for treating victims

shown to be almost fool"proof. It's called the "Heimlich Maneuver," after its inventor, Dr.
Henry J. Heimlich of Cincinnati. Dr. Heimlich found that there is air in the lungs that can be used to expel the
dislodged food particle from the throat.
Using the Heimlich Maneuver is relatively

behind the victim and put your arms around ple of inches above the

Q: My husband and I have that neither spouse could joint savings and bank ac- have exclusive control over counts. Would this property be laxable as part of che estate if one of us should die? A: Joint savings and bank accounts which are community property cannot be governed by a joint tenancy provision in the contract with the bank or savings institution. Community prop erty laws therefore would give each spouse one-hal ownership of the joint ac counts, and the one-half belonging to the deceased spouse would be included in the probate estate eligible for death taxes. Tax laws concerning joint accounts created before 1977 and cluding contributions from either spouse's separate either spouse's separate, or sify as taxable that the joint accounts part of the jeint accounts which is the separate property of the deceased person.

Q: I was paying for a home when I got married. I finished paying the mortgage after my marriage. Can I sell this property without my husband's consent? And, if my husband and I sepa forcing him to give me my share of our income tax re fund?
A. Property bought by person before marriage remains the property of that individual after marriage and can be sold without the consent of the spouse. How ever, any community income utilized to meet mortgage payments could be subject to reimbursement claims by the spouse when property is divided in a divorce. Income tax refund checks jointly payable to a husband and wife must be endorsed by
