A: Federal bankruptey law exempts property which is also exempt under applicable state law. Under the law of Texas, you would not lose your car and your
household goods in the event you declare bankruptey. Beyou declare bankruptcy. Be-
yond that, youll be allowed to keep your homestead,
household and kitchen furniture, tools and books of your trade, family portraits and pictures, one piek-up truck
in addition to the car. current wages for personal services, provisions on hand for home consumption like food, all wearing apparel and one dog.
as changed hase next door times in the past year or two. There is a large tree on the edge of the lot which is about to fall on our house. What can we do? We asked the original owner to remove it before she sold the house, but she refused.
A: If this tree actually fell
on your house, you would, of on your house. you would, of
course, be able to sue for the damages it did. With that in mind, the law also provides
a remedy to keep the tree from falling on your house. You must file suit to remove
the tree. It's called a suit to abate a nuisance.
Q: Fve been wanting to ask this for a long time. While in college, I lived in an apartment. When I left, my $\$ 25$ deposit was withheld, presumably for cleaning and a cracked window. Both reasons were totally untrue. Is there anything I can do about it?
A: If you owed no rent and if you gave proper notice, your landlord was legally required to refund your de-
posit. Though he's not enposit. Though he's not en-
titled to deduct for normal wear and tear, a landlord can deduct charges representing actual damages and
cleaning costs, if the lease cleaning costs, if the lease allows. But, the landlord
must furnish you with a must furnish you with a written discription and item-

cannot be held criminally liable for driving while in toxicated. This means that a juxenile stopped by the juvenile stopped by the
police and suspected of drivpolice and suspected of drivfluence of alcohol or drugs fluence of alcohol or drugs cannot be arrested as an adult and therefore does not face the possibility of having the driver's license suspended. The police, however, may turn over the
