March is National Nutrition Week, a good time to remember that food to meet the physical needs of the individua needs of the individua health. According to the Texas Department of Health Resources, dietary counselling is becoming recognized as a basic part of
of health care
Dietary counselling is the process of giving individualized professional guidance to help people to adjust their daily meet their health needs. meet their health needs It's up to the patient to
make wise food selecmake wise food seleche must understand his own nutritional require$m$ ents and follow the advice of the dietary counsellor.
According to Dr. Helen Campbell, director of the special nutrition project of the Department of Health Resources, dietary counselling the individual health plan, developed by a physician, for people with chronic illnesses and ditions such as obesity Frequently, the physician includes a professional, registered dietitian in the health care team.
The counselling may involve such factors as the patient's present food habits and eating practices. A variety of social economic factors, including ethnic and religious beliefs, must be that the dietary plan will be acceptable to the individual. The plan is developed, in writing, in consultation with the patient and is explained fully by the counsellor; in many cases, the patient's entire family is involved, since many people find it impractical to prepare special meals for one member
of the family. Of course the entire counselling process is supervised by the physician to mak sure that the dietary plan satisfies the health objectives that have been set with the patient.
This approach places important responsibilities on each person involved in the health care
process. The physician guides and directs the entire process, and must recognize the contribu selling can make to the The registered plan tian must develop a diet ary plan that satisfies the patient's healt needs, and determined by the physician, while at the same time satisying the tastes and habits of the patient. In mos cases, a nurse prvides follow-up supervision t ensure that the patient ollows the plan that has been prescribed and re difficulties to the physi-
cian and the nutritionist.
The central member The central member
of the team, of course, is the patient. The patient, or health careconsumer, must become more aware of nutrition as a cornerstone of positive health, and must realize the importance helping to develop and melping to develop and tionl habits. It is also tionl habits, It is also the patient's responsiblhealth care plan. Nutritionally, this means providing, preparing, and eating the foodsprescribed in the plan.
It's also important for the patient to be able to get in touch with one of the professional team members whenever question or problem

ductible even if, as a result of the education you eventually receive a master's de gree and an increase expenses for more d deduct than your more education than your employer quires, unless you can establish that the expenses were maintain skills improve maintain skills needed your position. Allowed itemized deductions might include tuition, books, and laboratory fets. If the

A. When you figure you credit, you may include payments you make to rela tives who are not your dependents for the tax year, even if they are members of your household, provided qualify as employment sub qualify as employment subject to social security tax.
