Since paper temperature and thereby inhibit plant growt it should be put down after plants are well into the growing stages.
Paper mulches have one of the benefits com m on to organic mulches--they decompose a nd removed at the end of the gardening season.
Organic mulches are
still the most popular today. They are effec tive in retaining soil moisture, in controlling and in reducing fruit rot. Organic mulches also improve the soil's physical condition where plowed under at the end of the season. it simply in $2 \mathrm{Tim}, 2: 15$ : "Study to show thyself approved unto God, a workman that needeth not to be ashamed, rightly dividing " or "handling aright" the word of truth results in Consider Mark $1: 15-\ldots \ldots$ repent ye and believe the gos pel" is often cited as what to do in order to be saved. But does repentence precede faith?

1. If repentance is represented as necessary to salvation and states: ". . . for whatsoever is not of faith is sin. " Faith comes by hearing the word of God (Rom, $10: 17$. . IF . . refore $\sin ($ Rom. $14: 23$ ).
2. If repentance is Biblical doctrine one only learns of it after hearing the word of God (Rom. $10: 17$. Then, one, by
faith, is lead to repentance! Jesus said that the men of Nineven "repented at the preaching of Jonah" (Matt. 12:41).
Their repentance came when their faith (belief) in the message of Jonah - the word of God - led then1 to it I
