### City Receives Sales Tax Check

Comptroller Bob Bullock said Friday his department has collected nearly \$1 million in sales tax judgments in the 16 months since he took office, more than was collected during the previous eight years.

Bullock said his sales tax division has collected \$993,000 in judgments since January 1, 1975, compared to only \$763, 000 collected in the previous eight years since the sales tax was implemented.

judgments "These were against hard-core delinquents who refused to pay until we went into 'court against them," he said. "They used to be considered uncollectable. Now we're starting to cash them in."

Also Friday, Bullock mailed checks totaling \$9.1 million to 599 Texas cities and towns, representing their May city sales tax rebates. Mc-Lean received a check for \$968.79.







by casting himself down safely from the pinnacle of the temple? (Matt. 4:5-7). Why would he withhold a miracle from those who asked for one to substantiate their faith? (Matt. 12:38f). Why not send Lazarus from the dead to convince the rich man's brothers? (Luke 16:19-31). The purpose of signs was to induce belief. (Mark 16:20) Then why with-

Since man is moral, God does not force man to obey, or even to believe. It is a matter of choice. (Joshua 24:15). Man must choose to believe. Sufficient evidence has been given to make this choice a conviction. (John 20:30-31)

Paul said, "I know and am persuaded . . . ."
(Rom. 14:14). It takes both. We do not act upon all we know because of lack of emotional acceptance. "Convince a man against his will, and he's of the same opinion still."

Forced belief would bring little penitence. More likely, it would stimulate a greater search for loopholes of self-justification.

No person will enter heaven without a willing search for truth! How sad it is that the world is full of people who "believe in Jesus" and are swept along with the multitudes, ignoring plain state-ments like "And hereby we do know that we know him, if we keep his commandments. He that saith, I know him, and keepeth not his commandments, is a liar, and the truth is not in him" (1 John 2:3-4). God speaks of them in this manner: "And for this cause (i.e. because they received not the love of the truth, that they might be saved. (2 Thess. 2:10) God shall send them strong delusion, that they should believe a lie: that they all might be damned who believed not the truth, but had pleasure in unrighteousness" (2 Thess. 2:11-12).

Love for the truth is evidenced by a continual

search of it. This truth is found only in God's Book the Bible, the only source of saving faith! Faith is not forced. YOU must choose to believe.
