In all fairness, and in view of the fact that Supreme Court decisions have been split as narrowly as five to four, it should be noted that nowhere are mere words more confusing than in the

Plainly it is time - while our states still have some prerogatives - for Congress to provide the Justices with firm guidance. To this end, Rep. Smith has introduced a bill in the House (H.R.3), and Sen. John J. McClellan an identical bill in the Senate (S.3) stating that when Congress intends to cancel state law with a Federal law, the new legislation must say so. If Congress does not clearly say that the new Federal law preempts state laws on the subject.

No business presently before the Congress is more vital to the preservation of the states and the strength of the nation tha the "3's' in the House and Senate. They are the business not only of our lwmakers, but of every citizen who is concerned over the preservation of his country in the highly successful pattern established for it by the founding fathers. And when we say "every citizen," we include the President whose special and sworn duty it is to keep the United States on its traditional track. year that Congress would break the spending requirements requested by President Eisenhower in his \$77.8 billion budget.

Actions thus far simply have not borne the contention out. The House this week trimmed more money from the President's requests, slashing \$30 million from a bill funding the Justice Department, State Department and U.S. Information Agency.

A week earlier, the House took \$126.5 million from the President's request for 20-odd Federal Executive agencies. Thus far, in every one of the appropriation bills that have been presented to the House, the members have voted less mo-Berlin corridor by East Germans ney than President Eisenhower asked for. Occasionally, the Congress allocated more funds for a specific purpose than the Chief Executive had requested, but reductions in other areas were largwas the burial of John Foster Dul- er than the additional grants, and the result in the House thus far has been an overall reduction.

> More of the same could be brewing, as the House Foreign Affairs Committee has just voted to reduce the Administration's foreign aid bill by \$266 million before sending it to the floor, where it is certain to be the target of even more attempted cuts.

IN ADDITION, the House Appropriations Committee has trimmed about \$400 million from the Defense Department Appropriations Bill for 1960.

The Committe is careful to point out that it increased the funds in some fields, reduced them in others; and feels the changes made will increase the overall deterrent power of U.S. military forces over the next few years. The changes were made after four months of detailed hearings, minute examinations, and top secret testimony from high Pentagon brass in all services.

Included in the committee action was an additional \$200 million for Army procurement to advance the Nike-Zeus - the Army's anti-ICBM missile. At the same time, the committee slashed the Air Force Bomarc missile requests by \$126.7 million, saying it had no assurance the Air Force missile would work, and pointing out that it is not exceptional. Thus the Arrmy has won round one in its dispute with the Air
