Baptist Church Plans \$115,000 **Education Wing**

New 2-Story Addition To Extend East From Present Structure

Members of the First Baptist Church, meeting in regular conference Wednesday night, gave the final go-ahead signal in approving construction of a new education building wing to the present church plant, an addition estimated

to cost approximately \$115,000. The new wing, which will add approximately 10,000 square feet of floor space to the plant, will be located on the lot directly east of the present building, bordering on Water Works Drive. The second story of the new addition will bridge the alley behind the church, leave this passage open to cars and giving access to the present building on the second floor.

The new addition, the first floor of which will be 56 by 80 feet and the upper floor 56 by 100 feet, will house a modern elementary, junior and young people's department. The church offices will also be located in the new structure and space is provided for a church library. Space in the present building will be used for assemblies and classes for other departments, thus giving all groups space needed for better teaching programs, the it possible for rthe church to accomodate an additional 300 persons grams, the pastor said.

To all appearances, that vast area of banditry and hoodlumism revealed by the McClellan Committee would remain open as the happy hunting ground of gangster labor leaders. Congress, said the cynics, was too largely tied to the wheels of the Golden Juggernaut of Big Labor.

But it happened. In passing the Labor Union Reform Bill (essentially the Landrum - Griffin measure), Congress did rise to its duty. Congressmen did - in surprising numbers - face up to this vital issue and defy the lightning that sundry labor officials, such as James Carey of the International Union of Electrical Workers and headman George Meany of the AFL - CIO, have promised will strike them down.

Today, as these lawmakers fare forth among their constituents, we hope that the deserving ones receive a proper accolade for their courage and statesmanship. In givving the American people a law that will do what is needed most in protecting both the public at large and the rank and file of labor from the most dangerous and insidious abuses of corrupt union chieftains they have rendered distinguished service to the nation.

It should be remembered, however, that in this fight the solons had support and guidance such as they seldom enjoy. The world's greatest lobby - an aroused American public - rose up in its wrath and clobbered the union's special




