



1% Discount For Payment in Dec.

NO DISCOUNT ON SCHOOL TAXES

If you desire. you can pay your taxes two payments - First Half in October of November and the last half by June 3 without penalty.

No discount on first half payment but of last half payments 3% discount if paid before April 1; 2% if paid before May !; and 1% if paid before May 31.





No yearbooks were printed because of paper shortage, business meetings were curtailed, but all reports relating to Federation matters were sent to State and District
