to 75 million irradisted flies a week to maintain the barrier.

The key to this atomic-age battle against the screwworm is the fact that the female blow fly mates only once in her short lifetime and by releasing sexually sterile male flies in an area of infestation the chances of a female producing a batch of fertile eggs is small and the species finally breeds out of existence.

The Crockett county donation from ranchmen was the second largest in Texas, only Val Verde county exceeding the amount raised here. Funds will still be needed, as only about half the original goal of 3 million dollars has been reached.






