



SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 19 proposing an amendment to Article IX of the Constitution of the State of Texas to add a new Section to be known as Section I-A which permits the Legislature to delegate certain zoning powers to the governing body of any county bordering on the Guif of Mexico or the tidewater limits thereof.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

Section I. That Article IX of the Constitution of the State of Texas he amended by adding thereto a new Section, immediately following Section I. A the Legislature may authorize the governing body of any county bordering on the Guif of Mexico or the tidewater limits thereof.

"Section I-A. The Legislature may authorize the governing body of any county bordering on the Guif of Mexico or the tidewater limits thereof, parking and travel of motor vehicles on heaches available to the public by virtue of public right and the littering of such heaches.

"Nothing in this amendment shall increase the rights of any riparian or littoral landowner with regard to beaches available to the public by virtue of public right or submerged lands.




