#### **Complexion of County** Govrnment to Change With New Year

There will be some new faces in the courthouse come January 1. A new county judge and two new members of the Commissioners Court will officially take office with the beginning of the new year, the result of voting in the Democratic primaries in the spring and the general election in Nov-

ember. Assuming the mantle of county judge, the fifth in the 71-year history of Crockett county, will be M. Brock Jones, who was nominated Spring primaries and was unopposed in the general election.

Brock Jones will succeed County Judge Ralph Jones, who has been serving in that capacity under appointment of the court fol-S. Smith in November of 1961. Prior to his appointment as judge Newly named as directors were Ralph Jones had served several terms as County Commissioner from Precinct 1.

A new Commisioner from Precinct 2 and another from Precinct 4 will take their places on the court at the first meeting in Jan-

Rex Halydier, nomintaed over a big field of contenders in the primary and elected withou opposition in the generel election, will succeed R. L. Flowers, who was appointed as Commissioner from Precinct 2 in the shifting which followed the death of Judge Smith and the appointment of Commissioner Jones to succeed him. #### Wool Growers To Hear Prominent Speakers At **National Convention**


