





community development and a more comfortable and satisfactory way of life has been accomplished in Ozona in past years. Some of it has been accomplished through the cooperative effort of service clubs, some by the effort of dedicated individuals, and still more by the overwhelming weight of an informed and cosmopolitan citizenship that has made Ozona a unique community. People of Ozona have demanded the best in most cases and most of the time they have pushed aside the opposition to get it. The community's very nature has been conducive to growth. It's cosmopolite tastes demanded satisfaction and business and industry responded accordingly

If the burgeoning organization will furnish a vehicle not heretofore available to some fireball community workers who can inspire others to take up the cudgel for community development, it will be a monument to its founders. But if its sole accomplishment is to saddle on the shoulders of a paid executive the task of maintaining the spirit of Ozona which has carried the community forward through the years, if it is to substitute dollars for personal effort, if it is to substitute professional know-how for community-minded determination, then its organization is a sad mistake.

Men working together in a common purpose and toward a common good, can accomplish much. If the men and women interested in Ozona's growth and improvement are willing to give of their blood, sweat and tears as well as their money, marbles and chalk, then much can be accomplished working through organization. If not, there is not a Chamber of Commerce secretary in the world big enough to do the job.

Poll taxes were not assessed on your 1962 tax bill and unless you added poll tax payment to your tax check, you have not paid a poll tax and will not be able to vote in 1963 unless you do so.

POLL TAXES MUST BE PAID BY JAN. 31 **TO VOTE IN 1963**

Persons who reached their 21st birthday during the calendar year 1962 or who will reach 21 before an election in 1963 must apply for an exemption certificate at least 30 days before an election.
