




#### WYOMING MAKES 20

Last February 6 Wyoming passer a Right-to-Work bill. The margin was substantial - 33 to 23 in Author of "New Country" and oth the House and 16 to 11 in the Senate. And this was accomplished in the face of the most aggresive sort of opposition.

Wyoming's act makes it the 20th state to forbid compulsory unionism. The principle of Rightto-Work, aside from differences of detail in the various state laws, is plain. Neither union nor employer can demand that a worker join or not join a union. The decision is entirely up to him.

Right-to-Work is thus a force and a highly important force on the side of individual freedom, then, beyond that, it is a force in favor of better, more responsible, labor organizations. A union which must sell itself on the basis of worth and service is a very different sort of union than one


