H. S. Registration **Shows Enrollment** Will Top 200 Mark

All Students Start **New School Term Tuesday Morning**

Pre-opening day registration of high school sudents having been completed Monday. Tuesday and Wednesday of this week, everything was in readiness this week for the opening of the new 1963-64 school term next Tuesday, Sept-

Guessing as to whether the enrollment would be up or down came to an end with completion of the registration Wednesday. With a couple of hours yet to go before the end of the final day's registration, when the freshmen registered, High School Principal J. A. Pelto reported a count of over the 200 mark in high school.

There are usually a number of students who fail to register in the pre-opening period and register on the opening day of school. If such is the case this year, the high school registration could well go over last year's opening day high school registration of 206.

Pupils will be enrolled in the junior high and elementary grades on the opening day of the new term. What these enrollment figures will be here this year is still a matter of conjecture but all educated guesses put the total as down some from last year, principally because of the closing of the Air Force radar station here this summer. 




