Gun Accident Is Fatal To Worker At Power Plant

James Wooten Dead Of Rifle Bullet In Home Accident

The builet struck Wooten in the head just over the right ear and emerged in the center of the forehead. He was rushed to the Mc-Camey hospital where he was pronounced dead on arrival.


