

Voters will spend little time making their choices in the run - off primaries lune 6.

On the Democratic party ballot there will be two races up for decision of the voters, while the Republian party has only one race for decision in the run off.

Democrat voters will pick the candidate to run on the party ticket in the November general election for the post of Congressman at Large from Texas. Incumbent Congressman Joe Pool of Dallas was forced into a run-off with candidate Robert W. Baker of Harris county (Houston). This is the only statewide contest to be found on the run-off ballot
