

RICHARD WHITE

BELIEVES EFFECTIVE REPRESENTATION IS STILL THE KEY ISSUE



Malcolm McGregor has tried in every conceivable way to divert attention from the key issue of effective representation, and the records shown here will explain why.

RICHARD WHITE

Richard White served two terms in the State Legislature. During these two terms he became recognized as one of the most active and effective legislators in the House. While in office, he authored, introduced, and passed six times as much legislation for his state and his home district as did McGregor who was serving on the same delegation at the same time. Just as important, he carefully studied each piece of legislation to come before the House and as the result of his studies he introduced

After completing his service in the House, White remained active in the Democratic Party being elected to serve as El Paso County Democratic Chairman. He is a proven aggressive legislator who votes by content of a measure instead of fancy titles, and he is an active Democrat.

WHITE'S OPPONENT

Malcolm McGregor has served ten consecutive years in the Texas House. With such a tenure, it should be assumed that he is by now one of the most respected and influential members of the House, a man at the top of the seniority ladder. THE OPPOSITE IS TRUE. During the last session of the Legislature, when Mc-Gregor should have been at the height of his political career, he was, instead, relegated to political obscurity. HE HELD NOT ONE SINGLE CHAIRMANSHIP, not one single vice-chairmanship, nor was he a member of any

major committee. He was able to pass only two of ten bills which he introduced. McGregor's loss of prestige in the House is attributed to his voting record over the last several years. While some of the legislation he has supported has been good, he has tended to vote by title rather than content of a bill, and he has usually ended UP IN THE CAMP OF A LOSING MINORITY BLOCK. Titles of some of these bills have been appealing, but they were defeated because of content which would have been unfair to a majority of the citizens of Texas.
