Mr. Davidson, who had been active in ranching all his life, died in the Crockett County Hospital Friday morning after suffering a heart attack at his home a short time before. As was his custom, he had gone to a downtown cafe to have coffee with friends in the early morning and had returned to his home to prepare for a trip to San Angelo when the fatal attack came.

Services were held at 3 p. m. with the Rev. Leonard Garrett, pastor, officiating. Burial was in Cedar Hill Cemetery, Janes Funeral Home in charge of arrangements.
