A new Crockett County oil field has been named and assigned production allowable by the Railroad Commission, Oil & Gas Division.

The Tippett (4,950 Wolfcamp) field was opened June 25 with completion of Standard Oil Co. of Texas, Midland, No. 1-40 J. H. Tippett, 14 miles south of McCamey.
