A new case of hepatitis was reported in the city during the past week. A child in the Latin-American community was diagnosed as suffering from the disease, Dr. Lloyd Sherrill, who is county health officer, reported.

Members of the child's family have been given GG Crockett County Courthouse ing short-stop and Munoz, in the recent elections. shots and precautions taken to prevent spread of the disease, the doctor said. Poor sanitary conditions are most often responsible for spread of the disease, he said.

Several cases of hepatitis have been reported in the community in recent months. the doctors agreed, and efforts are continuing to improve sanitary conditions and to guard against communicable disease outbreaks, No specific course for the hepatitis outbreaks has been pinpointed.

indication of age. Hunting rattlesnakes has become a popular winter pastime throughout Texas. In some places, such as Sweetwater, rattlesnake round-ups are staged annually. They attract contestants from throughout the state, as well as from other states.

Most hunters capture snakes by spraying gasoline into known rattler dens and catching the groggy reptiles after the fumes have driven them into the open.

Favorite weapon is a snare. of aluminium tubing with a one end. This loop is drop- jaws are completely vertical. ped over a snake's head and loop taut.

Some people even eat rattlesnake. Those who have injecting more toxin. tried it say it is fairly delectable. It tastes something about one drop for each 50 like a cross between chicken and fish.


