Mrs. Perry, Deputy emption, however, under the tax - assessor & collector, new voter registration law, everyone must have a certificate to be eligible to vote.

There is no cost to register. although an application for the certificate must be made giving name, address, age, birthplace, information about citizenship, occupation and residency status. The application must then be turned in at the tax office and a voter registration certificate will be issued if applicant is eligible.

If applicant has resided in state for more than one year, or the county or city for more than six months, a statement of the year in which such residency began shall be sufficient. In lieu of the dates on which residency began, applicant may show the length of residency in the state, county or city; the month, day and year on which residency began must be shown if the period required for voting has not

If applicant is under twenty-one years of age at the time of registration, the date of birth must be shown by month, day and year; if applicant is over twenty-one years of age, a statement of the year of birth is suffiages to get water flowing one years of age or over at the time of registration, age
