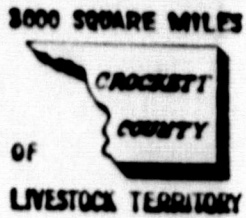

Road Construction Job Worker Crushed Under Wheels Of Dump Truck

Bobby Glenn Whisenant, 42, a grading foreman for the R. N. Adams Construction Co., employed on a segment of Interstate 10 construction between Ozona and Sonora, was killed instantly

shortly after beginning his day's work Friday morning. Whisenant was crushed to death under the wheels of a huge dump truck when the truck, driven by a fellow worker living in Sonora, was accidentally backed over him. Whisenant was between two trucks signaling one to back up when the truck behind him mistook the signal and backed up, crushing him to death.

The Whisenant family moved here about 3 weeks ago and lived in a trailer home in the northwest section of Ozona. They moved here from Clarendon.

Funeral services were held Monday at 3:00 p. m. in the Calvary Methodist Church in Weatherford, with burial in Brown Cemetery in Aledo.

M. Whisenant was born September 23, 1925, in Weatherford. He was reared in the Aledo community and was a veteran of the Korean War. He had worked for the Parker County Commissioners Court and later for the R. N. Adams construction Co. He had recently been promoted to foreman.

Survivors include his wife, a daughter, Mrs. Odie Harris, 2 sons, Bobby, 14, and Jimmy, 8, all living in Ozona at the time of the accident; his mother, Mrs. H. E. Whisenant of Aledo, and four brothers.

General Rains Brighten Winter Range Prospects

Rains the past three weekends have brightened the ranching prospects considerably in Crockett County. The heaviest fall yet was recorded last weekend, amounting to 2.43 inches for Ozona and more than 4 inches in some sections south of town.

Friday, intermittent showers amounted to .52 of an inch, with 1.93 inches falling Saturday all day and into the night. Sunday .08 of an inch was recorded with skies overcast all day.

The fall was lighter in the north part of the county. The Vaughn ranch reported 1.25 inches, with other ranches reporting 1.50, including the experiment station north of Ozona. However, 3 inches fell at mid-way lane fifteen miles north of Ozona during the three-day period.

Draws ran, fences were washed away and Hwy. 163 was closed to traffic Saturday as the heaviest rainfall recorded this year fell in the extreme south part of the county. The George Montgomery ranch reported 4.50 to just under 5 inches approximately the same as the James Baggett ranch, with lesser amounts recorded toward Ozona.

The Ashby McMullan ranch east received up to 4 inches, with 2 inches falling in one hour Saturday afternoon in a heavy down-pour. From all reports, up to 4 inches fell generally in the east and southeast parts of the county.

Reports from areas in the western portion of the county indicate a general fall of from 1 inch to 2 inches, with slightly larger amounts recorded in the Pandale area.

Crockett Heights five miles east of Ozona, recorded slightly over 3.50 inches, including isolated showers Tuesday and Wednesday. The rains brought temperatures down to below normal and pleasantly cool days and nights have prevailed.

Janie Edgerton has been selected to receive the \$500 C. J. Davidson Scholarship for her outstanding achievements in nine years of 4-H club work. Purpose of the scholarship is to stimulate an interest in 4-H members to pursue a course of college study and to provide financial assistance to worthy boys and girls.

\$3,000 Taken In Daylite Robbery Of Grocery Store

Around \$3,000 was taken from Lewis Drive-N Grocery Monday morning between 9:00 and 11:00 o'clock. The money, approximately \$1,400 in cash and around \$1,500 in checks, was in a bank money bag beneath the counter.

Lewis said he cashed a check about 9 o'clock from the bag and returned it to its place beneath the counter. When he attempted to find it at 11:00 o'clock it was gone.

So far the money has not been recovered. However, the sheriff's department is working on several leads.

Lions To Engage McCamey Fri. In 1967 Opener

The 1967 Ozona Lion football team will travel to McCamey tomorrow night to battle the AA Badgers in the first of three non-district encounters. Kick-off time in McCamey is 8 p. m. and many Ozona fans are expected to be on hand for the opening of the '67 grid-iron campaign.

Head Coach Sam Mosley and assistant Bill Gerber have 6 starters, 5 of which are linemen, returning from last year's 8-2 ball club. Mosley and Gerber are beginning their third year with OHS, compiling a 7-3 record in 1965 for a two year reading of 15-5.

The Badgers, who lost to the Lions last year 20-0, return 9 starters from last year's team. Coach Bobby Pollard's starting lineup is big, with good speed in the backfield. The Badgers are rated by most observers as favorites for the championship in District 2AA.

The Lions, boasting good size and experience in the line, will start juniors in the backfield and 3 juniors and 4 seniors in the forward wall. Last Friday night the Lions outscored Goldthwaite 3 TD's to none in the last scrimmage against outside opposition.

"We were pleased with the scrimmage, especially our defensive effort. The boys were hitting! Our passing offense looked real good, but our ground game has got to pick up," Mosley said of the Goldthwaite scrimmage.

Concerning tomorrow night's game, Mosley commented, "It will be a tough one, but we're in good shape with the exception of end Donald Huff who suffered a deep thigh bruise in the Goldthwaite scrimmage. We'll try him on offense, but probably use Diaz (Beto Diaz) at his defensive half-back spot."

Weightwise, the Lions will be outweighed slightly (181 to 182) on the line and are 163 to the Badgers 165 in the secondary.

Drawing the starting quarterback position for the Lions will be David Huff, 155 (Continued on Last Page)

Ranger Honored By Postal Service

Texas Ranger A. Y. Allee, Jr., along with Terrell County Sheriff Bill Cooksey, was honored at a Rotary Club luncheon in Sanderson Wednesday by the Postal Inspection Service for his efforts in apprehending a man who robbed a post office at Pumpville and wounded the postmaster.

Both men were presented checks for \$200 by Lester Biggers, postal inspector from San Antonio. Biggers said the service decided to make the awards in recognition of "excellent cooperation and assistance," resulting in the capture of Alfredo Amador Hernandez.

Hernandez, who is serving a 99-year term in Huntsville, was finally captured Aug. 20, 1966 in Dryden, by the two officers. The elusive bandit roamed the area for over a year, and seriously wounded Sheriff Cooksey before he was apprehended.

Crockett Lands Included In UT Oil-Gas Leases

A record breaking sale of oil and gas leases on West Texas lands owned by the University of Texas has been announced for October by the Board for Lease.

Included will be several tracts in Crockett county. A total of 191 tracts are included, the largest number of oil and gas leases ever offered by the fabulously rich University system.

Twelve miles south of Barnhart in block 31 of Crockett County, a drilling block of 1,691 acres will be included in the sale. A minimum bid of \$26,000 and an Ellenburger explorer to 8,200 feet, will be required of the buyer.

Another large spread listed in individual tracts, lying east of the drilling block, also is included in the sale. Those two sectors of interest are north and east of the Midway Lane and Buckhorn fields which recently have reported some interesting gas completions from the Strawn and the Ellenburger.

Six other blocks of acreage, containing quarter-section leases which do not carry drilling obligations, will be offered for sale in Crockett and Reagan counties.

The 191 tracts - totaling 50,988 acres - are located in Andrews, Coke, Crockett, Loving, Pecos, Reagan, Terrell, Upton, Ward and Winkler counties.

FORUM OPENS NEW CLUB YEAR TUESDAY

More than 40,000 telephones 27,000 customers are in the network which will make it possible for customers to dial direct to more than 93 million telephones throughout the United States and Canada.

All customers will receive by mail before September 10 an instruction booklet which tells precisely how to use the new service. Persons who have not received instruction booklet or anyone needing additional copies may obtain them by calling the business office during regular office hours, McCullough stated.

The equipment making this new service available is located in San Angelo, McCullough said. Plans for modification of, and changes in local equipment were begun more than four years ago. In addition to installing the intricate EDDD facilities in San Angelo, the overall project involved constructing new central office buildings in Carlsbad, Christoval, Eldorado and Sonora and placing new central office equipment in the buildings. Additional long distance circuits have been added between San Angelo and area towns so customers in the network can have access to the equipment.

McCullough pointed out that General Telephone customers will have a more advanced type of long distance dialing service than most. "All customers having DDD service can dial station-to-station long distance calls; however, the equipment we have also permits customers to dial their own person-to-person, collect or credit card calls."

"Long distance calls dialed by customers are automatically timed and all information about the call is recorded on punched tape, thus making the record of the call complete and accurate," McCullough said. The tape is later fed into a computer so the call is properly charged.

DDD began as an experiment in Englewood, New Jersey, in 1951. By 1958, 900 towns in the U. S. had DDD. Now about 86% of the customers in the U. S. can dial their own long distance calls.

Local officers, working round the clock during the three-day Labor Day weekend, reported a fairly quiet holiday. In spite of two traffic mishaps, there were no personal injuries.

Friday night a 1960 Chevrolet driven by Gary Loudamy uprooted a pecan tree and came to rest in Mrs. Ben Lemmons yard on Ave. E. The accident occurred when a tie-rod broke on the car after hitting a dip in the highway about 7:30 p. m. Kirk Boyd and Dennis Douglas were passengers in the vehicle. All three boys escaped with minor cuts and bruises, but the car was a total wreck.

The other accident occurred late Saturday night on the Todd Field road, when an unidentified out-of-town man overturned in a pick-up he turned onto the road thinking he was on the I-raan highway.

Plan Re-Entries In Tippett Field

Gulf Oil Corp. filed applications to re-enter and complete the lower zones as wildcats and the upper zones as wildcats or extensions to 4,950-foot Wolfcamp production at two projects in the Tippett multipay field of Crockett County, 10 miles southeast of McCamey.

The No. 1-G J. H. Tippett, former Devonian gas producer, 3 1/4 mile northeast of 4,950-foot Wolfcamp oil production and one location southeast of lower Leonard oil production, will be plugged back to 6,370 feet.

It was drilled to 6,362 feet and completed in February, 1948 and deepened and re-completed in the Devonian for 6 million cubic feet of gas daily at plugged-back

depth of 6,420 feet.

Location is 3,501 feet from the northeast and 330 feet from the northwest lines of 40-31-H&TC.

The No. 4-B J. H. Tippett, completed this year as a small lower Leonard oil producer and in March 1956 from the regular Wolfcamp field pay, will plug back to 6,180 feet.

Operator had filed application Aug. 23 to plug back to 6,500 feet and complete as a 3/8-mile northeast extension to 4,950-foot Wolfcamp production.

Location is 4,508 feet from the northeast and 440 feet from the southeast lines of 40-H&TC.
