






Vending machine systems permitting credit card purchases of food and drink have been put into operation in two Chicago, Ill. firms. Users insert their credit cards into a slot on the machine where the card is registered. then returned. A computerized, punched-tape, recordkeeping system records each purchase by date, item. amount and card number.


