The system goes into effect January, 1968, in Crockett County. All employees and elected officials of the county. will have 7% of their total earnings withheld from their salary checks each pay period, plus a fifty-cent administrative charge. In turn the county will match these sums by taking the total amount from the salary fund. The plan covers all county officials and employees except the justice of the peace and the county agent, who are enrolled in other retirement plans, and parttime employees.
