Congressman H. R. Gross of Iowa, perhaps best stated the situation recently. He says "The United Nations never ceases to harp on the subject of minorities and in espousing the theory of "one-man, one-vote. Late last year the UN General Assembly's Trusteeship Committee voted independence for seven little territories, including Pitcairn Island with a population of 90. Antigua, population 61,664, Dominica, 68,501, Grenada 91,967. Nevis Anquilla 59,476, St. Lucia 110,142, and St. Vincent 88.451.

"Each of these" he continues, "including Pitcairn Island with its 90 persons, will have vote in the UN equal to that of the United States with its more than 200,000,000 population. 



The furry female, as yet unnamed, is scurrying around the cage it shares with its parents. Tom Abbott, exhibit director, said in the wild the prairie dog pups are born in "nurseries" as much as 14 feet underground. These conditions are difficult to duplicate in cages, where the animals have to make nests with wood shavings.

The black-tailed prairie dog (Cynomys ludovicianus) once ranged over most of West Texas and lived in huge "towns" consisting of hundreds of thousands of animals. Now they are reduced in numbers until only a few
